Meet candidates for parliament

The federal New Democratic Party nominated MPP Noel Duignan's executive assistant to be its candidate for Halton-Peel in

the Oct. 25 election.

Norma Peterson, who has had some politcal experience, was selected to be the party's candidate during a meeting in the Glen Williams town hall on Sept. 19. was nominated She Georgetown resident John Nichols.

Peterson, who lives in Fergus, has been Duignan's executive assistant since March of this year. She has been a parliamentary assistant since last February.

Peterson was also one of at McKenzie-Smith School, Duignan's constituency assistants from 1990 until this year.

From 1982 until 1988 Peterson was a councillor in Kincardine, Ontario. She was on various committees including finance, environment and parks.

This is not Peterson's first election as a candidate for parliament. In 1984 she ran in the federal riding of Bruce Grey; in 1985 she ran in the provincial riding of Huron-Bruce and two years later she ran in the provincial riding of Bruce. She has never been a member of parliament.

Peterson is married with two children.

Unemployed and frustrated? Feel like you are alone? Several programs within North Halton are being offered to unemployed. Those registered for jobsOntario may register for the following.

In Acton, jobsOntario will be offering a Changes, Challenges and Choices training program. This course will take place on Oct. 4-8, 12-15 and Oct. 18 and is aimed at providing participants with a realistic view of today's job market, the ability to recognize the challenges facing them and how to make the changes appropriate to their situation. Classes run 9 am to 2 pm plus one hour of counselling time. Participants will examine the economic and business cycle, deal with stress and time management, learn communication tools, job marketing skills and assess personal skills.

This program is offered to those who qualify for jobsOntario training. To qualify you must be receiving social assistance, FBA, be a U.I. exhaust (your UIC claim has run out), be ineligible for U.I. or receive worker's compensation. Call the jobsOntario Hotline at 878-8113 and ask for extension
