

Cooperating with fire department

Continued from Front Page and has listened to the regulatory bodies."

Foley stores the tires and has Modern Recycling Inc. of Lewiston, N.Y. pick them up for exporting.

He appears to have adhered to a number of recommendations the Fire Department made during their initial visit. Foley presently stores under 5,000 tires which sit within MOE rules, he set the tires within the minimum width of the east-end fence, met requirements for the height (300 cubic metres) and length of piled tires, kept the tires at an acceptable distance from accessible roads, and kept the ground of the site firm enough to withstand the weight of fire fighting equipment.

"On his own accord he put up a No Trespassing sign," said Ford, who added Foley secured the fence, made installations to the fence and had the gates locked and secured. "Most were labour jobs and were not much of a cost factor. He also doesn't have maintenance

bills to pay." Foley and the Fire Department are in negotiations about implementing a fire safety plan if an emergency on the site arises.

"We've dealt with him on a regular basis and discussed different interpretations of the (fire) code to help him out and have him understand where we were coming

from," Ford said.

Ford brushed off the thought of a "Hagersville II," saying with a solid rubber material, "someone would need to use a substantial amount of flammable liquid or accelerant to speed up the ignition process.

"I believe we will have Foley's cooperation in the future."

Although the official reason for the closure is the lack of profitability, Herrington claims the underlying cause is political.

"Basically, it is a political issue between (Maple Leaf Foods) and

the Town and all these poor people are getting caught in between," he said.

Mayor Russ Miller, who received an advance copy of the notice on Monday morning, has tabled the impending closure of the complex for future discussion at a Town council meeting.



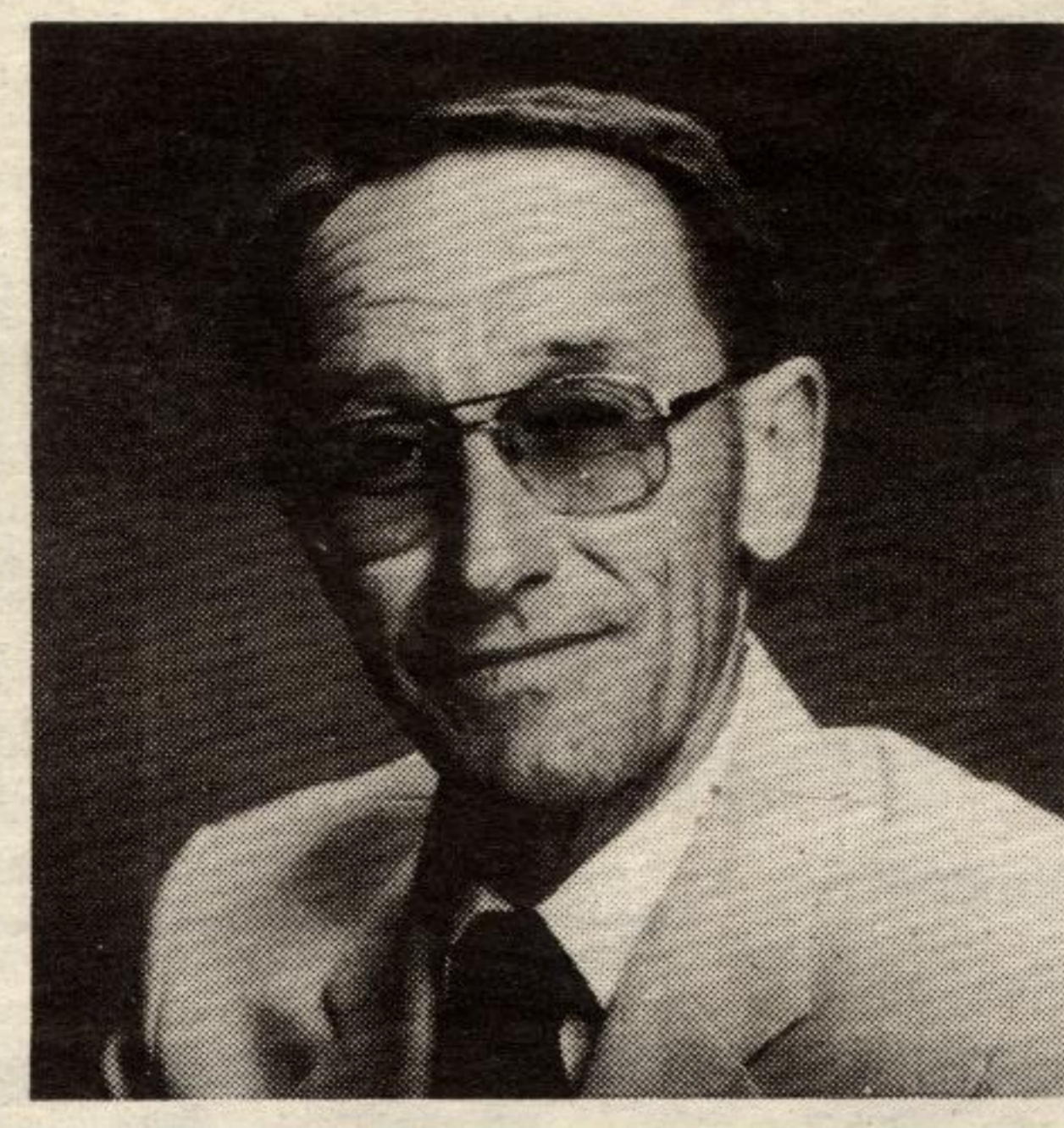
