





Crime prevention up to you

Here's more about Operation Identification, the effective program introduced in last week's column.

Last issue I told you that you can borrow the engraver at our Acton office. You can also pick up some stickers and decals.

What number do you use?

We recommend you select a personal identification mark such as a driver's licence number. Businesses, schools and other organizations can contact local police to obtain a special identification number.

Remember — there are other citizens waiting for you to return the engraver, so please be considerate ... complete your marking and return the engraver within the loan agreement time.

I can provide you with a checklist of items usually

stolen from homes or businesses. Too often police recover property which cannot be identified, and it ends up in the police auction. Don't let it be yours.


