Liberals garner all but one of Acton polls

The following chart is a breakdown of all 14 polling stations in

Acton, which show votes cast in Monday's federal election. Figures are unofficial.

The first column shows the number of the polling station, followed by the actual number of votes for the Liberal Party (Julian Reed), PCs (Garth Turner), Reform (Dick MacDuffee), NDP and all others.

The percentage figures show the percentage of votes cast in that poll for each party in the same order.

To find out how your vote af-

ected the outcome, simply check the numbers in the column next to your polling station.

The accompanying figures demonstrate some revealing facts: the Liberal "Red Wave" swept through Acton, but their popular vote percentage was less than the province-wide trend.

In fact, the PC and Reform Party percentages (28 and 29 per cent of Acton totals) were higher than most other ridings in eastern and central Canada.

Incumbent Garth Turner took

only one poll in Acton, while Julian Reed won the other 13. Turner's PCs were victorious at Polling Station 79, where residents from the Bovis area of town (Acton Boulevard, Division Street, McDonald Boulevard, etc.) marked their ballots.

The Reform Party made impressive gains in Acton. In fact,

there were 88 votes cast for Dick MacDuffee at Polling Station 80 (central Acton, Bower Avenue area); just seven votes shy of the Liberals' 95.

The NDP's Norma Peterson finished behind the "other" candidates at a number of Acton polls, gaining only three per cent of the popular vote in this town.

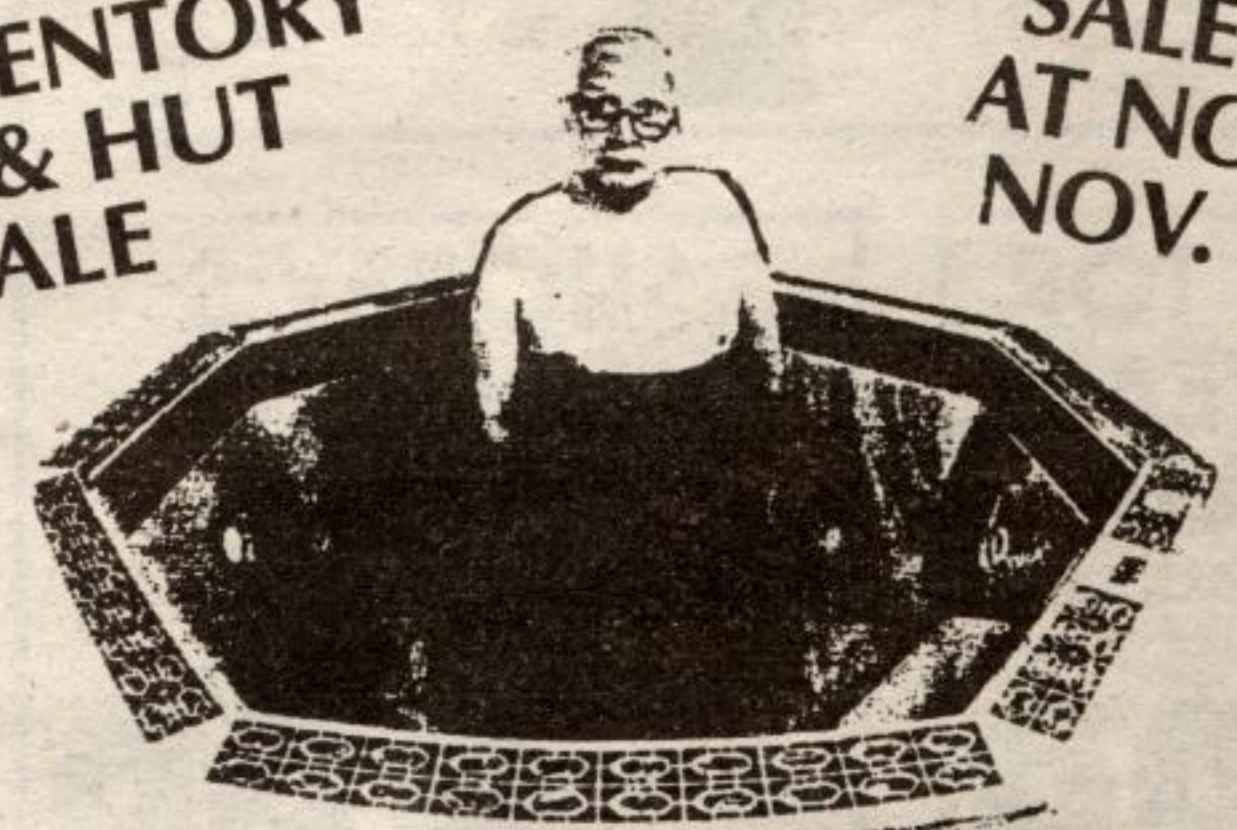
