It was the culmination of a 10-year run with the local club for the 17-year-old to reach the pinnacle of her young skating career.

"The most important thing is to maintain confidence in yourself and work hard both mentally and physically. I'm relieved it's over," sighs Burt, who was graded on her flow, expression and timing.

The Gold Series is comprised of four dances — a Viennese waltz, Westminster waltz, quick step and Argentine tango — that are patterned after ballroom dances.

Burt enjoys waltzes and says the Viennese is her favourite because of its gracefulness.

"In the dance test, which is a prescribed test in front of three judges, you have to make clean, deep edges and be more intricate in your stepping," says AFSC president and test chairperson Barb Metelka.

"A lot of skaters drop out midway in their training. It takes a lot of work and you have to stick to it.

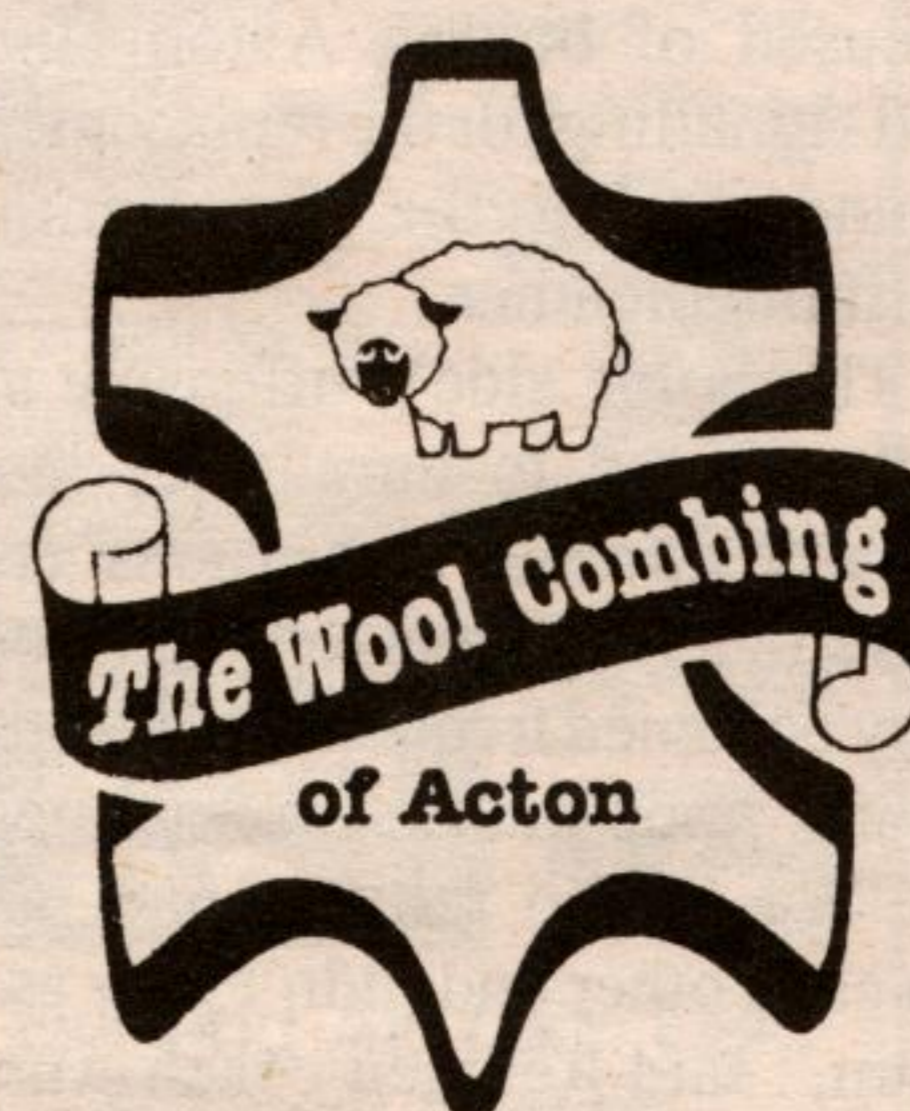
