environmental study of the building until it is declared pollution-free. All of these safety procedures should be maintained until the building is demolished. Immediate action must be taken to remove the PCBs from the site (there is a substantial amount of PCBs in an outbuilding).

The best security this building had were the tenants. The company decided, as is their right, to vacate it.

It's not enough for them to board up the doors and walk away. Not when the safety and security of our children, our neighbours and ourselves is concerned.

If you agree with me, take action. Call your councillor, the mayor, the Region, the Ministry of the Environment and anyone else you can think of.

Maple Leaf Foods caused this situation and I think that it's up to them to put it right.

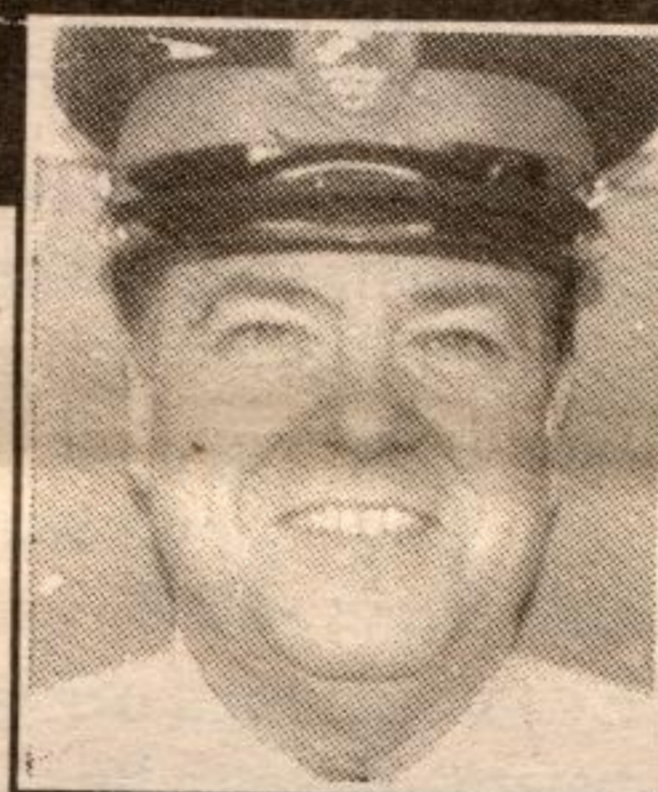

Take time to streetproof kids

Last week I outlined some more tips on streetproofing your children, here are some more ideas:

Parents, if your child tells you something has happened, believe your child and provide support. Children often feel it's their fault that things happen. Be sure to support them by assuring them that they are not at fault. Make every effort to do something about what the child tells you, the incident is important to them.

A child should be taught that if someone is attempting to touch them or is bothering them to begin yelling. Words such as: "You are not my mother/father" will usually attract enough attention to either distract the possible molester and make them flee or the child will be able to flee.

All children should be taught never to accept money, candy or rides from strangers. If a stranger asks them to go somewhere, such as to look for a lost puppy or kitten, the child should not become involved. This is a common ploy for child molesters.
