environmental study of the building until it is declared pollutionfree. All of these safety procedures should be maintained until the building is demolished. Immediate action must be taken to remove the PCBs from the site (there is a substantial amount of PCBs in an outbuilding).

The best security this building had were the tenants. The company decided, as is their right, to vacate it.

It's not enough for them to board up the doors and walk away. Not when the safety and security of our children, our neighbours and ourselves is concerned.

If you agree with me, take action. Call your councillor, the mayor, the Region, the Ministry of the Environment and anyone else you can think of.

Maple Leaf Foods caused this situation and I think that it's up to them to put it right.




