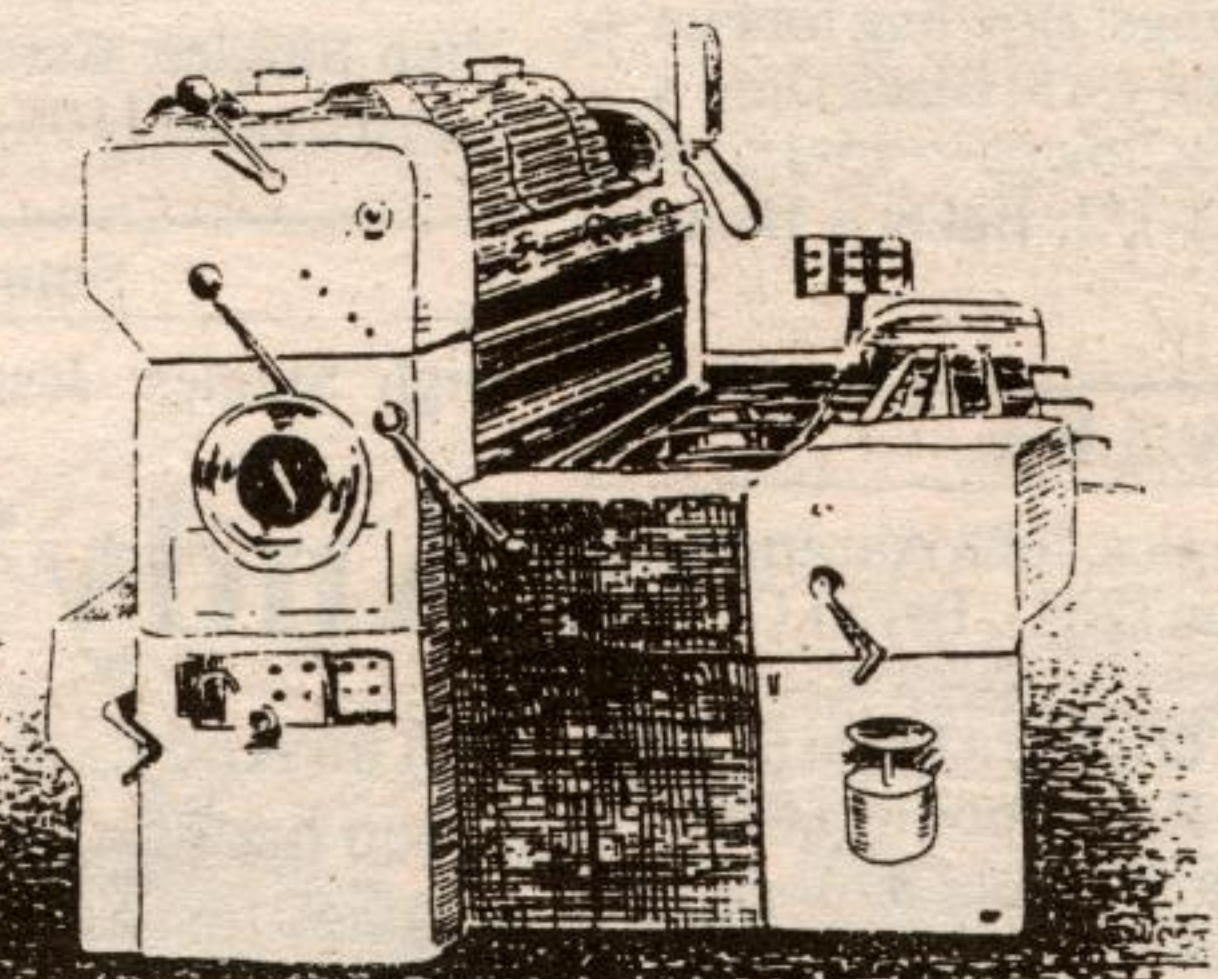
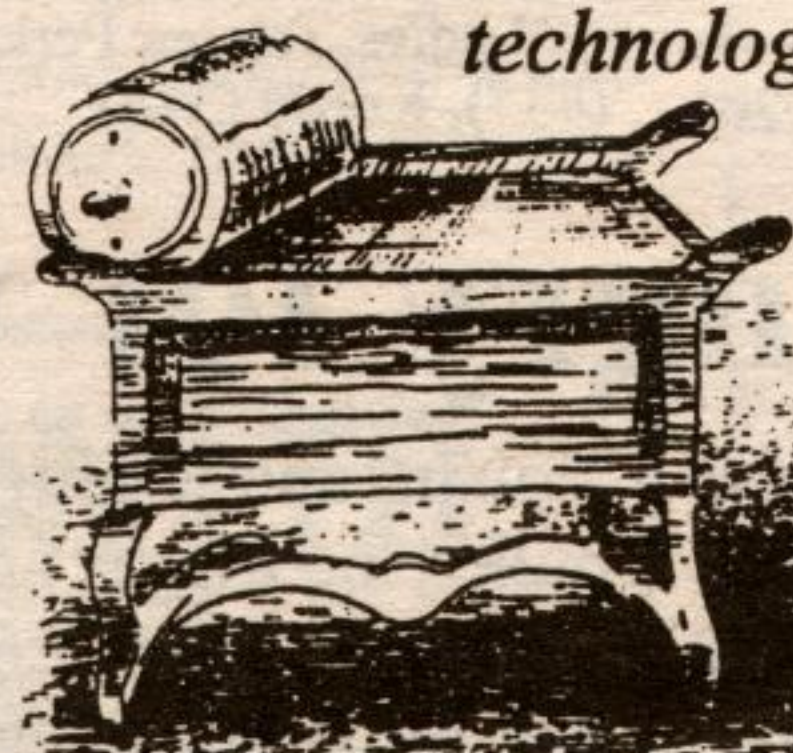

NOTICE

NO SMOKING BY-LAW FOR CERTAIN COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS

On October 12, 1993, Council enacted By-law 93-203 regulating smoking in certain types of commercial establishments, as follows:

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 3, 1994

- Smoking is **PROHIBITED** on the following premises:
 - Retail stores
 - Elevators, escalators and stairways
 - Reception areas
 - Shopping mall concourses
- **Health Care Facilities** must provide a designated smoking area
- **Restaurants*** must designate 25 per cent of floor area devoted to seating as a non-smoking area
 - Restaurants with fewer than 30 seats are **EXEMPT**
 - Restaurants whose annual liquor sales are 51 per cent or greater of their gross annual sales (food and liquor) are **EXEMPT**.

For further information on this by-law or about the availability of no smoking signs, please contact the Clerk's Office at 873-2600.

NOTE: The Civic Centre will close at 2 pm on Friday, Dec. 24, 1993 and will remain closed until 8:30 am on Tuesday, Jan. 4, 1994 in order to fulfill the Province's Social Contract requirements and to accommodate statutory holidays.
