RATE REDUCTION

Dear Customer:

Halton Hills Hydro is pleased to announce a two per cent reduction in hydro rates, effective Jan. 1, 1994.* For a typical residential customer this equates to an approximate reduction of \$20 per year (or \$45 per year for a customer with electric heat).

As your local utility, Halton Hills Hydro buys power from Ontario Hydro. The wholesale cost of power from Ontario Hydro, which accounts for 86 per cent of our expenses will remain at 1993 levels. For your information, a table of rates appears with this notice.
