Merchant wants schools to shop in Acton

Should Acton schools shop in Acton for their Pizza Day menu?
A miffed Andy Katsilieris of Andy's Restaurant and Pizzeria and three of four local public

and three of four local public schools say yes, but St. Joseph's Separate School continues its association with Pizza Delight in Georgetown.

"I think the money should stay in town. It bugs me enough to make me upset," says Katsilieris.

The downtown merchant says St. Joseph's is the only school in Acton he doesn't do Pizza Day business with.

"I give the schools a good deal," says Katsilieris, who delivers the pizzas personally.

Katsilieris estimates that Robert Little Public School has made close to \$700 selling pizza and milk. Robert Little conducted a poll at the end of the 1992-93 school year and found 87 per cent of the students preferred Andy's pizza.

"I always try to use in-town businesses first for anything. We've been very fortunate that Acton businesses have been able to serve our needs," says Robert Little's principal Deanna Nodwell, of the school's once-a-month pizza day.

Meanwhile, Anna Wood, who has been St. Joseph's pizza organizer the past four years, has never conducted a preference poll, though she says the students are happy with Pizza Delight.

She defends her choice to do business in Georgetown by saying Acton businesses couldn't accommodate her requests when she began heading the pizza days. She also feels it wouldn't be fair to the Georgetown business to make a switch in favour of Acton.

One of those requests, Wood says, was to produce rectangular shaped pieces. "That way each kid gets the same size of slice and it's easier that way." Wood orders 28

to 31 20-piece rectangular pizzas at \$11 each from Pizza Delight.

"The decision to leave town started from personal preference. I wasn't crazy about the pizza in Acton," says Wood, who includes Andy's, Nonna's, 2-for-1 and Queen's Pizza in her list.


M.Z. Bennett's principal disagrees.

"I certainly wouldn't go out of town for business if I could help it," says M.Z. Bennett principal Lynn Snider. "The service from Andy's has been great. It works well for us."

Andy's also supplies pizza to McKenzie-Smith for their pizza days and sporting events.

Wood says that St. Joseph's does use Acton's Freezer Frenzy each week for hot dog buns for the school's hot dog day. They also use local businesses for after school activities. She admits that using Acton businesses could be cost saving.

"It might be cost saving, but I don't feel comfortable with it. A lot of the time there are no businesses here in town and often you don't get the service you want from the businesses that are here," explains Wood.

In French we did a one day unit on hockey. Everyone had a great time.


