Council agreed to designate Feb. 7 as "Lighten Up Canada" day, after Jack Carpenter appealed to them on Monday night.


"Lighten Up Canada' day originated right here in Acton three years ago, to help bring smiles and laughter to the residents during tough economic and social times," Carpenter told Council.
