A donation was made to an area family who recently lost everything when a fire destroyed their home.

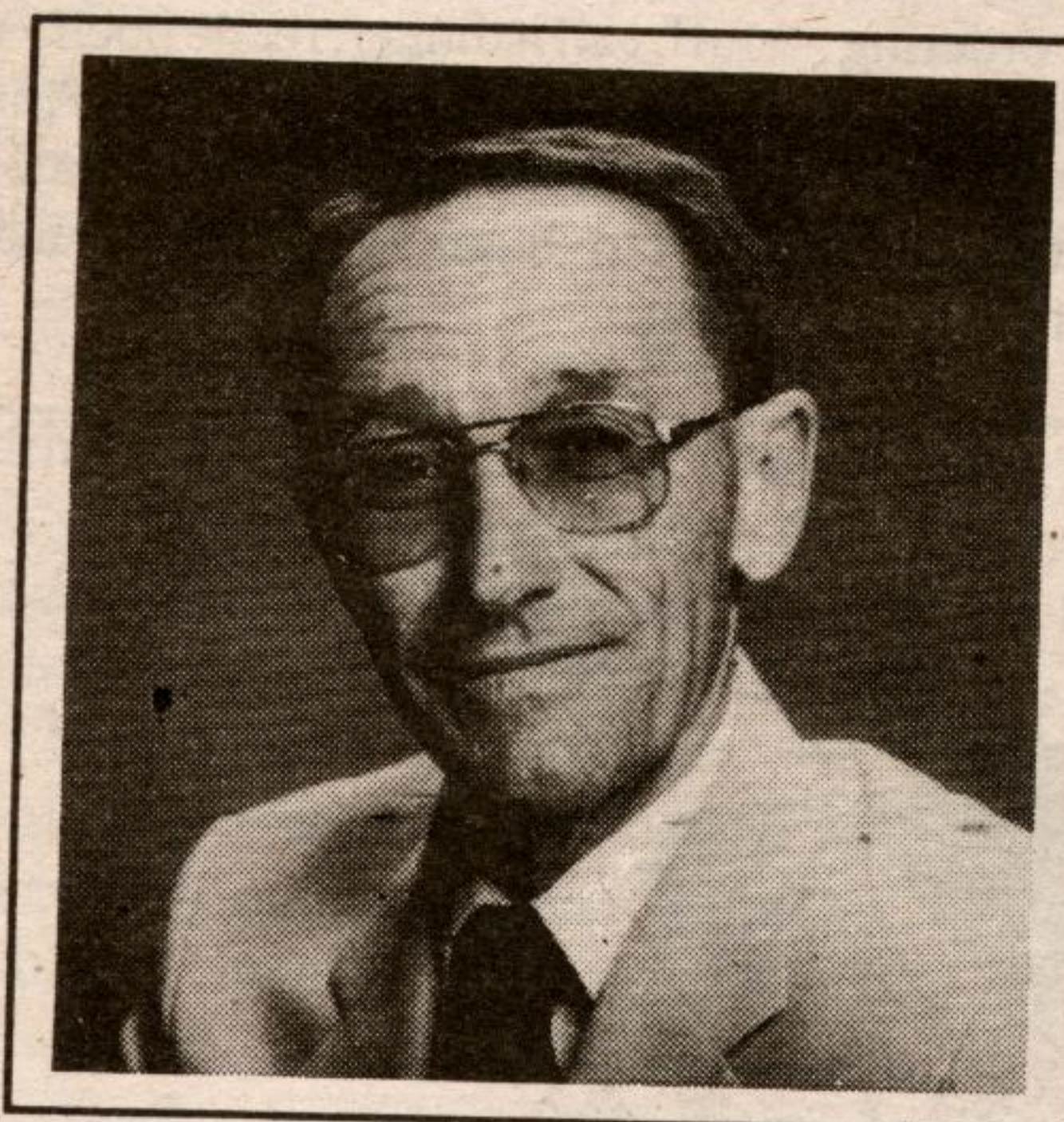
Plans were made for some of the ladies to attend a February workshop in Fergus.
