The results are as follows: 8 and under Girls — Kristina Galvin, first, 50-metre breaststroke, second, 50-metre freestyle and 50-metre backstroke.

Eight and under Boys — Jason Charland, first, 50m backstroke, second 50m freestyle and 50m breaststroke.

In the 9 and 10-year-old Girls event, Toby Slack, third, 100m freestyle, fourth, 50m breaststroke and backstroke, fifth, 50m freestyle; Caitlin Lichty, fifth, 100m freestyle and sixth, 50m breaststroke; Veronica Addley, sixth, 50m backstroke.

Stephen McKeon-Foley represented the 9 and 10-year-old boys by winning the 100m freestyle, taking third in the 50m backstroke and freestyle events and fifth in 50m breaststroke.

In the 11 and 12-year-old Boys' bracket, Nick Pliotas, third, 100m freestyle, fourth, 100m breaststroke and fifth 50m freestyle; Steven Potterton, second, 100m backstroke and sixth in 100m freestyle; Paul Kerins, fifth, 100m backstroke.

Roshini Kassie captured firsts in all her events in the 13 and 14-year-old Girls' category — 50m freestyle, 100m backstroke, 50m butterfly and 200m Individual Medley.

Sylvia Bragg-Smith also grabbed a fifth in the 100m freestyle and sixth in the 100m breaststroke.

For 13 and 14-year-old Boys, Mike Lenizky took top honours in the 50m and 100m freestyle and 100m backstroke.

Joel MacDonald added fifth place showings in the 50m and 100m freestyle events.

Girls 15 and over — Athena Schmitt, first in 50m and 100m freestyle and first in the 100m breaststroke.

The Aqua Ducks' 9 and 10-year-old, 200m freestyle relay team finished second. In the other 200m freestyle relay events, the Girls' 11 and 12-year-old team took first, the 11 and 12-year-old Boys placed second and the 13 and 14-year-old Girls counted third.
