Bants lead 2-0

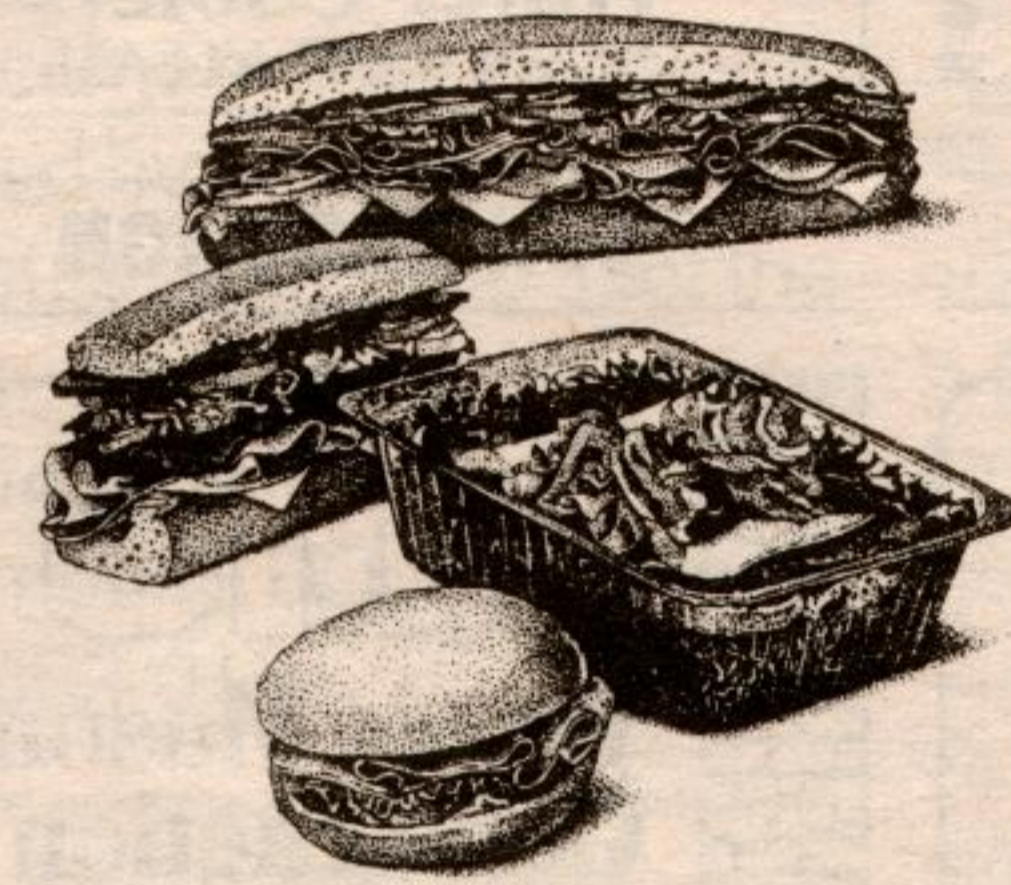

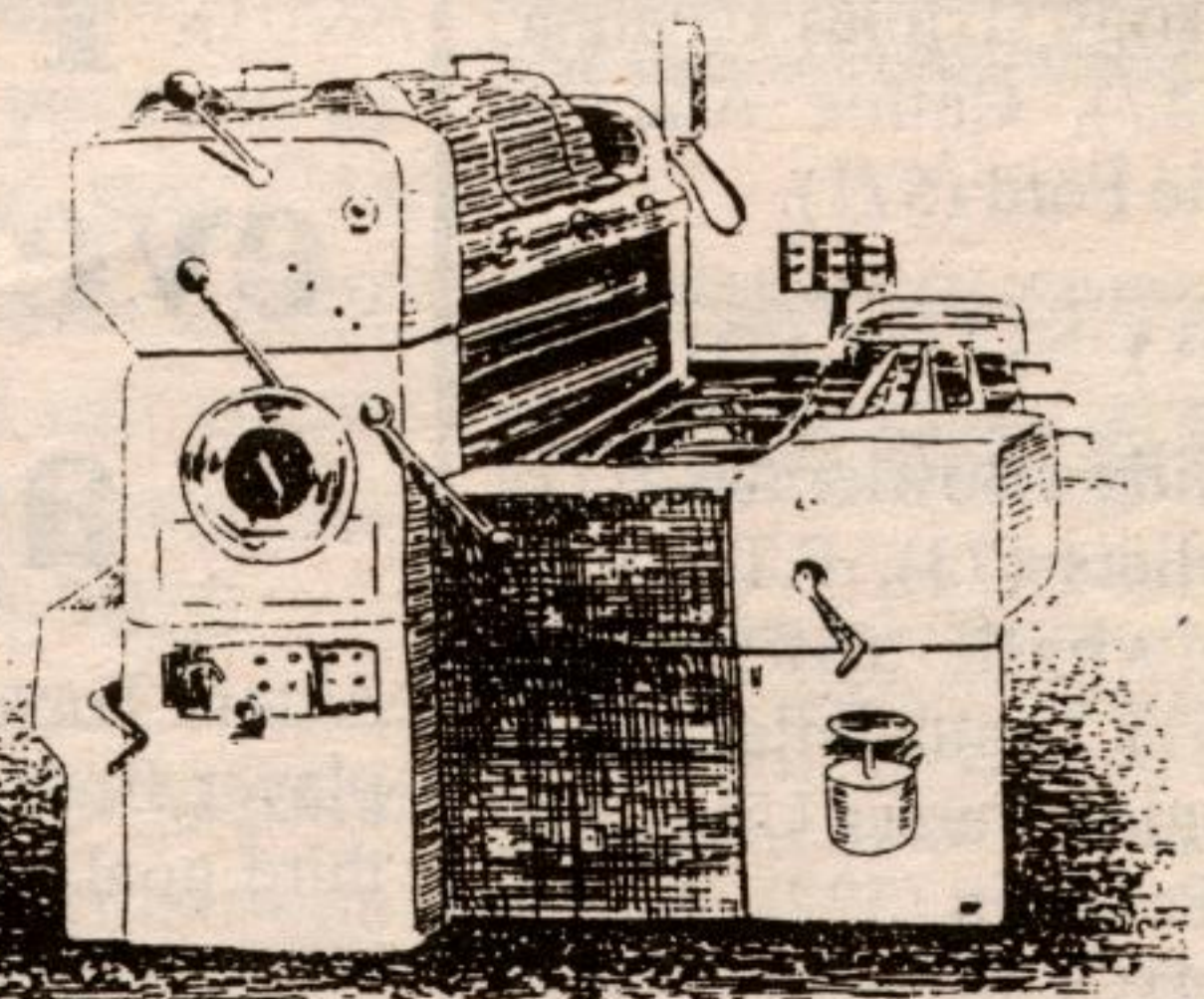
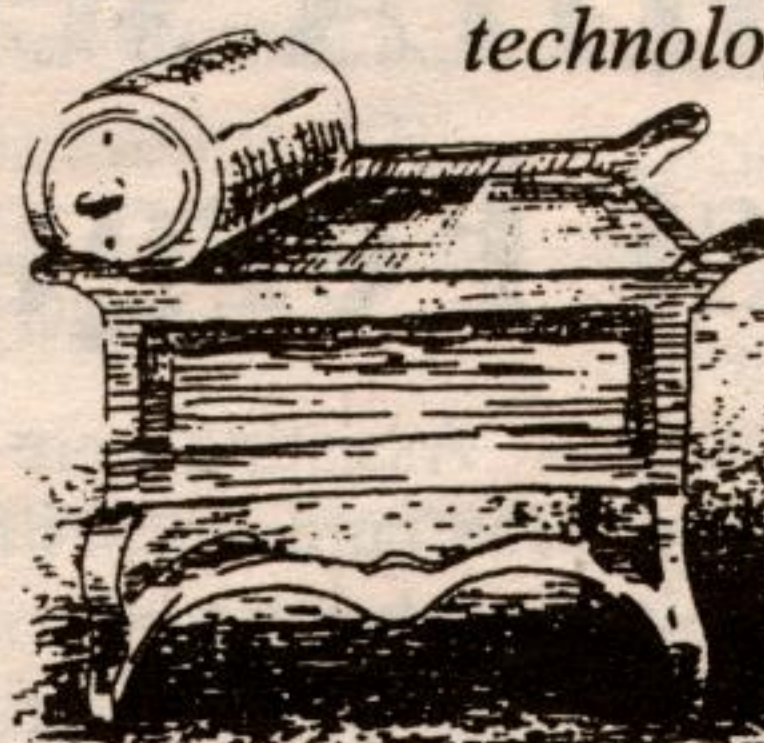
