Bartucci still in the dog house

Acton resident Maurizio Bartucci ended up in a debate with Council members and Municipal Law Enforcement Officer Ron Stein at Monday's Council meeting.

Bartucci, who runs a dog kennel athis R.R. 1 residence, approached Council in hopes of clarifying the status of his kennel license.

Bartucci has operated his kennel for 12 years and is presently facing a criminal charge of break- Feb. 21 meeting. ing noise regulations after several of his neighbours complained of the noise last August.

"I'm only allowed to have three dogs at my residence and they all have to be licensed separately. I've had to move all of my dogs to other premises and this is becoming very costly," explained Bartucci in an interview prior to the meeting.

Bartucci feels he is being discriminated against because other kennels are able to operate even

though they currently may not comply with kennel regulations.

Counc. Gerald Rennie disagreed: "None of the kennel licenses have been renewed for 1994, so Mr. Bartucci is not being discriminated against."


Council decided that no further action would be taken until a formal report is completed and received from the Town's lawyers.


