Snyder relishes change of scenery

Wrestler Scott Snyder's mat strategy is simple: Go into a match strong and get it over with.

It appears to have worked for the Grade 10 Acton High student after compiling a spectacular 32-

14 record in his first full-year on the Halton high school circuit.

In the span of a year, Snyder's wrestling world turned full circle.

Hebegan wrestling as a Grade 9 in Iowa at Ottom wa High School. After posting a 15-5 record, Snyder suffered a back injury that "hurt just to walk."

But after a long recovery and move, Snyder raced onto the local scene this year. He adapted to free-style wrestling from collegiate south of the border and to competing as a rookie on the Georgetown Rebel squad from being the centre of attention at Ottomwa.

"The move was worth it as long as I got the chance to wrestle,"

says the personable 16-year-old. "There are a lot of tough guys here and they know a lot more. I've been used to three, one-minute periods to a match in the States with a break. Here, the matches are four minutes."

Snyder also faced a drastic

change in conditioning methods. In Iowa, he would always be on the mat, but at Georgetown Highhe was running stairs for 10 to 12 minutes a practice and working with endurance weights.

"Mr. Hall and Mr. Daniels are the best coaches I've had. They're good motivators and know

what they're talking about," he acknowledges.

Perhaps the biggest move for Snyder, though, occurred off the mat. Being the lone representative from Acton High and not too familiar with the Halton mat wars, Hall thought it would be in Snyder's best interests to find a teammate from Acton.

He found a successful one in Carlos Scappin. Throughout the

year, the two frequently talked wrestling and traded stories between themselves and among their Rebel mates.

"I tend to get psyched out if a guy is known as a good wrestler," concedes the 127-pound grappler. "The guys give me tips on opponents' tendencies and tell me that I can beat them. They're all good friends, so it's like a big family."

Snyder received support from them, too. His mother attended all his matches with a video recorder in hand and quietly became her son's second coach.

"They (the tapes) have helped," Snyder admits. "I've improved my throws. Before I wasn't going all out with them, but I realized I had to commit all the way to do them right. I think match-to-match."

Snyder prefers to leave the talking to his mat performance when answering critics of his small stature.


"The greatest satisfaction is right after pinning a guy you shouldn't have beat. It's such a high because it doesn't happen all the time," he explains.


Snyder plans to attend the Canadian championships in Edmonton in three weeks and hopes to move up a weight class next year.


