Swimmers set personal marks at OFSAA meet

Amanda Bonnell, a Junior swimmer in the primarily Senior event, led Acton with a ninth place overall in a field of over 90 girls. The Grade 10 student also set an Acton High 50-metre freestyle record of 30.59 seconds.

Junior swimmer John Eddolls also impressed, placing 17th as an alternate swimmer in the 100m freestyle. His time was 1:01.68.

The Senior Boys' medley relay team of Eddolls, Greg Finley, Darryl Darby and Daniel Bonnell finished 15th out of 33 in 2:10.59.

"The whole team did very, very well. We didn't have a large team, but what we had was excellent quality," says Fountain. "Just to qualify for OFSAA was an accomplishment.

Meanwhile, Acton High grabbed five medals at last Monday's Halton swim championship at the Etobicoke Olympium.

Eddolls led the way with three, winning the Junior Boys'100m freestyle in one minute, 2.87 seconds and netting a silver in the 50m free (27.51) and 100m Individual Medley.

In 31.75, Derek Tribe was fifth in the Junior Boys' 50m free. He also competed in the Junior Boys' 50m breaststroke, finishing eighth in a time of 42.63.


