





No news is good news

Police and fire department officials from Acton reported that there were no notable incidents involving police, or calls involving fire trucks, over the past week.

Halton Regional Police say there has been a significant drop in crime in Acton compared to previous years, while fire department spokespersons say that things are normally quiet at this time of year.

Seeking hit-and-run driver

Police are looking for the driver of a green pick-up truck after a hit-and-run collision, which sent a 17-year-old Guelph youth to hospital.

The accident occurred March 10 on County Road 34 near Puslinch. The pick-up truck was travelling in the opposite direction when it sideswiped a 1986 Pontiac and caused extensive damage to the front and driver's side of the victim's vehicle. The teenager was released from hospital later the same evening.

Seniors beware of sales tactics

Guelph OPP are warning seniors to be especially careful when dealing with door-to-door salespeople.

An Erin woman phoned in a complaint March 7 after a vacuum cleaner salesman used high pressure tactics to gain entry into her home.

Police say they have received numerous complaints about highly aggressive salespeople in the last few months. People are almost being forced to buy products or sign an agreement before the "invader" will leave the home.

Seniors are often victims of this kind of sales pitch and police are warning them to be especially wary before opening their doors to strangers.

Police warn of deer crossings

Police are also warning motorists to be on the lookout for deer crossing the roads after several accidents involving animals have been reported in recent weeks, and more are expected as spring approaches.

Motorists should be watchful at all times, but especially at deer crossings. Police caution that avoiding a collision with an animal is obviously the best alternative, but not if it means risking human lives by swerving into oncoming traffic. If a deer is hit but not killed, police or game wardens will humanely dispatch the animal.
