"Wendy Norman and her two directors were able to watch our performance and they were thrilled with the way our students presented the play. They loved the

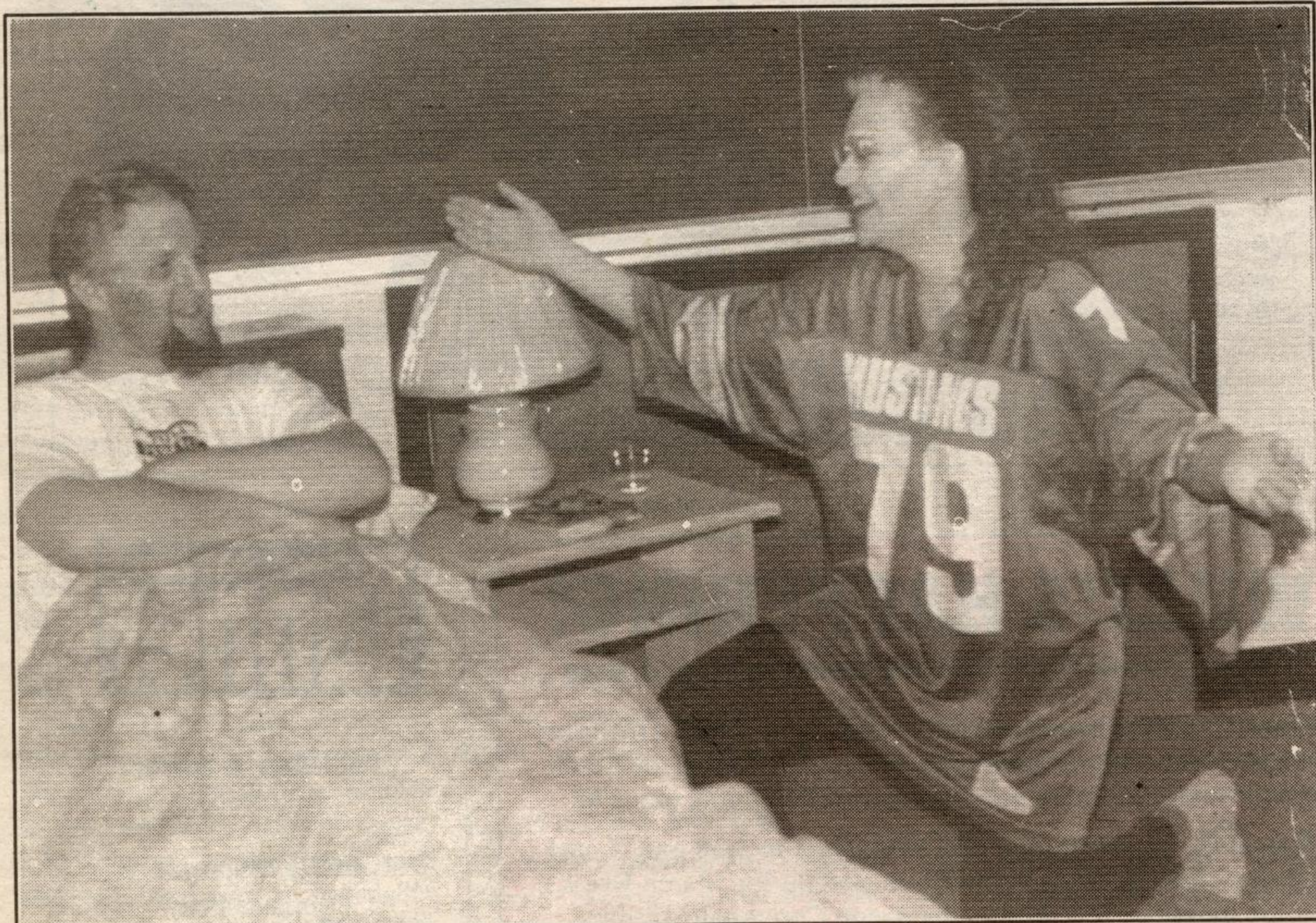
music and direction changes that were added. Wendy felt the students really captured the overall atmosphere she wanted in her script," boasts McDougall.

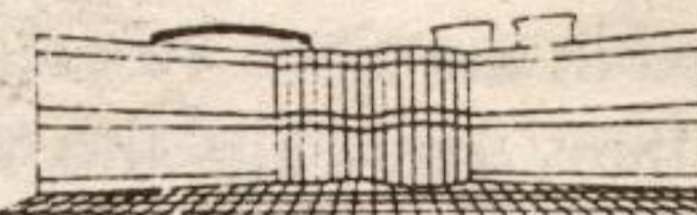
The purpose of this committee is:
