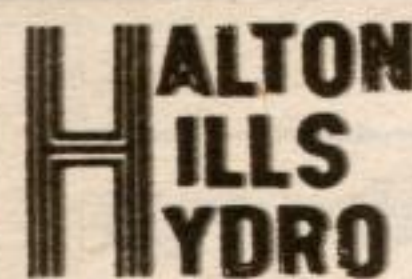

It would seem that one girl refused. The teacher explained that being a Canadian is something to be proud of, as our Olympic team demonstrated so well.

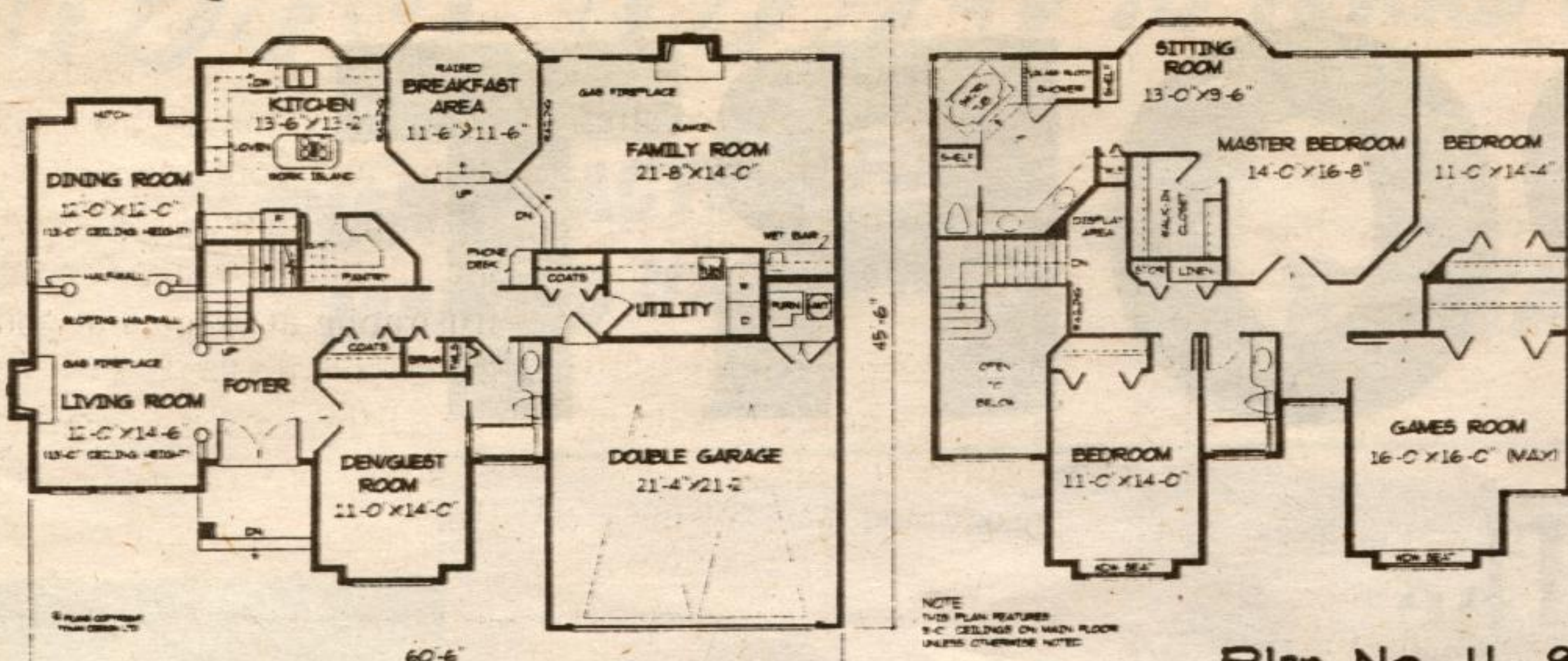
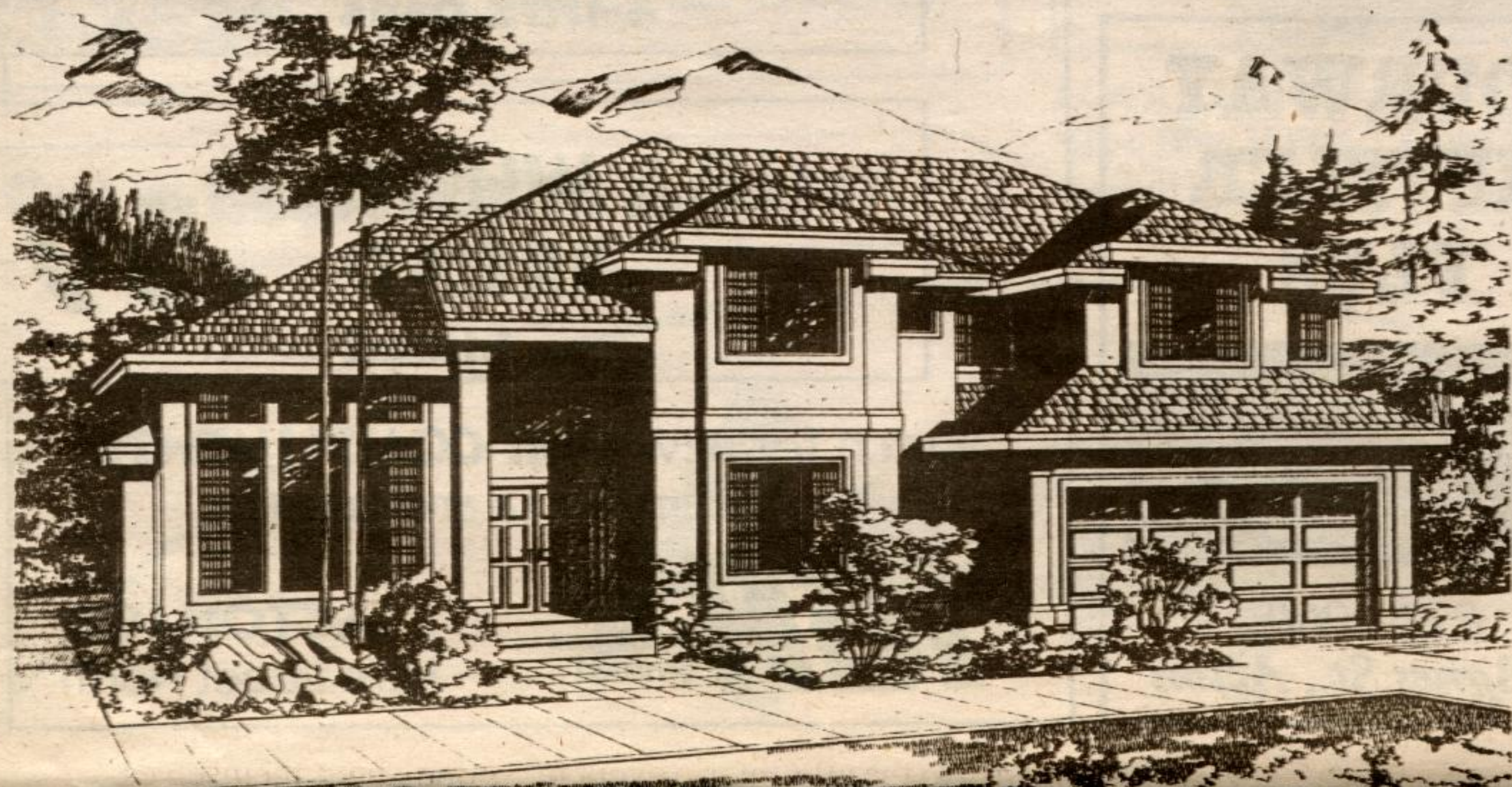
