Hudson is suspended indefinitely

Mike Hudson, a Rockwood native and centre with the National Hockey League's New York Rangers, has been suspended indefinitley by the NHL after a high-sticking incident on the weekend.

The 26-year-old Acton Minor Hockey product was assessed a match penalty for intent to injure and ejected from Saturday's 6-2 matinee loss to the Pittsburgh Penguins after high-sticking defenceman Kjell Samuelsson at the Pittsburgh Civic Centre.

The rulebook calls for an automatic suspension until the league has held a hearing and made a ruling. The hearing was scheduled for yesterday (Tuesday).

Hudson has scored four goals and added seven assists for 11 points in 48 games this season.

Chris Schiller was solid in the Andy's net.


Dunbar, from Strong and Citton, pocketed the lone goal of the game in Arthur on Friday.

Skating troika excels at COSIC championship

Acton Figure Skating Club coach Cindy Currie may still have a smile on her face from the recent Central Ontario Section Interclub (COSIC) competion in Norwood.

Her three students, Stasha Vancek, Cara McGilloway and Danny Pursoo excelled in their respective programs.

Vancek finished third in the Senior Ladies' Silver Freeskate, McGilloway captured second in Junior Ladies' Bronze Freeskate and Pursoo placed sixth in preliminary Mens' Freeskate.

Vancek and McGilloway have advanced to this weekend's Ontario Interclub championships in Sudbury. It will be Vancek's second trip to the all-Ontario event in the last three years, while McGilloway went last year.

"Everything went pretty good. There were only five (in my competition), so it wasn't that stressful," says Vancek, 16, of her COSIC performance. "My spins were really good. I'm glad I'm moving on."

"The marking was up and down. I didn't know how I was doing," McGilloway added.

"I'm pleased with all three of

them. They've worked hard," says Currie on Monday. "In the figures portion to be in the top half is a must, so you don't have to climb so high with the freeskate.

"Artistically, Cara and Stasha are both good and if they can both connect with their technical programs, they will have a good performance."

Currie was particularly impressed with Pursoo's ability to take to the ice and not hold back.

"Danny skated very well. He has skated aggressively this year," Currie praises. "In the past he's been timid, but he was really confident in himself and it showed in his program. I couldn't have asked any more of him.

"The main thing is they feel good about themselves."

While she didn't point to specifics, Currie hinted the judging was a little suspect.

"The audience's reaction is a good indication of how a skater is doing and sometimes I wonder what they (judges) see and what they don't," remarks Currie. "It's frustrating at times, but you take the good with the bad.

"All three met my expectations. From there, it's in the judges' hands."

Fire Bants advance to Tri-County final

A pair of victories last week for the Acton Firefighter Bantam hockey squad makes it four in a row and paved the way for a Tri-County championship.

The locals are involved in round-robin playoff action against Fergus, Erin and Arthur.

The Firefighters downed Arthur 11-5 last Monday and were 7-2 victors against Erin last Tuesday.

They suffered their first loss on Sunday, a 6-5 heart-breaker in Arthur, who they will meet in the Tri-County final regardless of Monday's outcome in Fergus.
