

Squirt, Peewee softball may fold

Acton Minor Boys' softball registration is hurting with the threat of the Squirt and Peewee divisions folding.

"We'll either fold the divisions

or move the boys to hardball," says Acton Minor Ball president Jennifer Wells, who notes five and six players have signed up for Squirt (10 and 11years-old) and Peewee (12 and 13), respectively.

Ironically, the introduction of hardball two years ago is the reason

for the drastic decline in this area. Atom (9 and 10-years-old) is already filled, while Wells expects

Bantam to be filled shortly. Meanwhile, Girls' softball signup is brisk, including the new Bantam (15, 16 and 17-years-old) division which has nearly filled its team of 14 players.

The mixed Tyke division of seven-year-olds has two teams so

far, down from three last season. Atom is on its way to two teams, Wells says. Peewee players, though, are needed as only eight players were on the roster as of late last week.

"There are a lot of new kids this

year," says Wells, who adds 274 kids have committed to baseball for the summer compared to 328 last year. However, there is still one registration left on March 24 from 7 to 9 pm at the Legion.

Limehouse, Kilbride and Hornby. Some teams will also play Milton and Cheltenham.

Hardball registration looks strong with the Rookie (Atom) division expected to field one team. Wells says there is still plenty of room in Mosquito (Squirt), Peewee and Bantam. Mosquito is likely to have three teams with Peewee and Bantam sending two each against the 1994 competition from Campbellville, Brookville, Waterdown, Kilbride, and Limehouse.

A Midget (16 and 17-years-old)

team has been added for the 1994 season.

"If we didn't get the team the boys would have had to play in Georgetown, but the Town gave us the okay to play at McKenzie-Smith," Wells explains. "They're going to cut the grass back, make a home-run line using stone dust and build a backstop fence."

However, the local Midget outfit will be forced to play its home games on Friday, Saturday or Sunday, since the McKenzie-Smith soccer field (situated beyond the outfield fence) will be in use from Monday to Thursday.


Also new this year, Wells adds, The softball is a T-ball select team. "It should be interesting. It will give them a taste of real baseball," comments Wells, who mentions Acton will see teams from Campbellville, Hornby, Kilbride and Limehouse.

Meanwhile, coaches for the upcoming season are needed in several areas. In softball — Atom Boys and Girls; Squirt Boys and Peewee Boys. In hardball — Peewee and Bantam. And T-ball coaches are needed for each of its five teams.




The Sabres eliminated Six Nations last Wednesday with a 6-3
