

Rotary Club hoping to raise \$4,000

Last year the Rotary Club of Acton assisted nine children with physical disabilities in the area through its sponsorship of the Easter Seals Society. In total, \$8,200 was contributed to the local children and families in need of services and equipment.

The 1994 Easter Seals campaign is now underway in the hopes of raising at least \$4,000 in the Acton area for local needs. "As the Easter Seal stamps make their way into homes across the region during the next few weeks, we hope all residents will contribute," says Larry Rigney of the Rotary Club of Acton.

Through local contribution, the Easter Seals Society was able to provide: wheelchairs, braces, artificial limbs and communication devices; transportation for children to hospitals and treatment centres; special summer camps for disabled children; and many other requirements, not covered by gov-

ernment programs.

In addition to the mail campaign, the Rotary Club of Acton is hosting a special evening on Saturday, April 9 at the Legion. "Line-up" for Easter Seals will feature an evening of line dancing and

other western shenanigans with all proceeds going to the 1994 campaign.
