

Business group plans strategy

They have the people and the plan, but they're still unsure what to call themselves.

They are Acton business people who are concerned about their town's business development situation and all the empty downtown storefronts.

'And, for now, they answer to the name "Action for Acton" or "Acton 2000."

The group has met since January and at their fourth meeting at Andy's Restaurant last Wednesday, they aired their concerns and ideas and finally came up with a focus for future efforts.

"We have to get the community more interactive and, once we show that we're an enthusiastic community, more business may become attracted to the town."

One idea the group is excited about is one that has roots in England — bringing a weekly "Trunk Sale" event to town every Saturday morning. It's the brainchild of Acton's Jack Carpenter.

Fread says it's important the group keep its enthusiasm and work on ideas while the enthusiasm is still high.

The name of the group will be determined at the next meeting set for April 6 at Andy's Restaurant at 8 pm.

Also on the agenda will be the election of an executive and filling out the committees with volunteers who will work alongside committee leaders Fread, Deakin and Andy Katsilieris.

"Whether you own a business, work here or live here, we need these people — ones who care about this town—to come out and show they give a damn about the direction Acton is taking," states interim chair Paul Nolan.

The Smile Theatre Production is a non-profit, charitable organization that has been presenting fine plays for the past 21 years.


