### Referees still needed for Rockwood soccer season

The biggest concern for Rockwood Minor Soccer this year surrounds the men and women in black.

League president Bonnie

Zukowski says there are no carded referees this year, meaning substitutes will be imported from Fergus, Acton, Kitchener and Guelph.

She points out it could cost the league up to \$5 per referee for

each game once travel expenses are dealt with. Referees are paid based on the level of play they oversee (i.e., an Under-17 ref would get \$17 plus travel fee).

"I guess it's a sign of the times," says Zukowski of the shortage. "A lot of people are working two jobs and this comes last. But I would still love to have some referees."

The league pays for a referee's clinic and travel expenses.

With a shortage, players from the Boys' Under-17 rep team will also referee, but won't be paid.

Zukowski expects at least 200 players to join the league for the 1994 season, despite a count of only 80 as of Monday afternoon.

The anticipated horde of soccer buffs are expected to fill the Rockmosa Community Centre on Saturday from 10 am to 1 pm for the final registration. It's the only non-Tuesday registration day the league had set. The fee for house league and rep play is \$50.

Zukowski says there will be two teams in each of the Under-7, 9, 11, 13, 15 and 17-year-old mixed divisions. The Preemie Division of 3 to 5-year-olds will consist of 17 players who will learn where torun in game situations and how to kick the ball. There will only be one Under-17 rep squad this year, but it will be fairly large, she adds.


