

# Bants lose Georgetown tourney D-Division, Tri-County finals

The mental and physical drain of playing six games in four nights caught up to the Acton Firefighter

Bantam hockey squad on Sunday at the Community Centre. They were thumped 9-2 by

Arthur and lost the best-of-three Tri-County championship 2-0 following a 6-4 defeat on Saturday here.

That followed a stretch of four games in three nights as the locals competed in the 34th annual Georgetown Bantam Hockey Tournament last week, compiling a 2-0-1 round-robin record in games against Riverside, Gloucester and Almaguin on Thursday and Friday. The Firefighters bowed to Glanbrook 3-2 in overtime in the D-Division final on Saturday.

On Sunday in Arthur, Matt Boycott, from Gary Genzler, and Chris

Williams scored in a losing cause.

At the Community Centre on Saturday, the home side fell behind 3-1 after the first-period and never recovered.

Derek McIntyre, Scott McIntyre, Steve White, and Aaron Forrest scored for the locals.

Assisting were Jon Routledge with two, Derek McIntyre, Aaron Forrest, Marty McKinnon and Chris Williams.

Entering the championship, the Firefighters sported a 1-2-1 regular season record against Arthur, while the teams split a pair of round-robin games.

Meanwhile, in the D-Division final at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena, the Firefighters held a 2-1 lead against Glanbrook, but suffered a defesive lapse in the dying seconds. Glanbrook quickly capitalized, tying the game with nine seconds left.

The game was scoreless until the third period when the Firefighters got goals from Derek McIntyre and Genzler to give them the lead. Jon Routledge and Dave Clark drew assists.

The Firefighters gained a berth to the final with a narrow 2-1 win over Almaguin on Friday.

Williams and Trevor Malloy scored with assists given to Adam Daponte with a pair, Genzler and Scott McIntyre.

In Game 2 of the round-robin on Thursday, the Firefighters downed Gloucester 4-1 on goals by Malloy, Routledge, Williams and Scott McIntyre.

Recording helpers were DaPonte and Williams with two, Malloy, Clark and Derek McIntyre.

The locals opened the tourney with a 2-2 draw against Riverside.

Williams and Derek McIntyre potted Firefighter goals.

Routledge, Forrest, DaPonte, and Scott McIntyre had assists.

**NOTES:** The Firefighters finished the Tri-County round-robin playoffs with a 5-1 record after shutting down Fergus 2-0 last Monday. DaPonte and Genzler found the net, while Routledge and Jason Pembleton assisted.

The Firefighters' lone loss was against Arthur, a 6-5 heart-breaker.

White and Malloy each contributed two goals. McKinnon pocketed the other.

McKinnon and White each had a pair of helpers. Singles went to Genzler, Clark and Scott McIntyre.

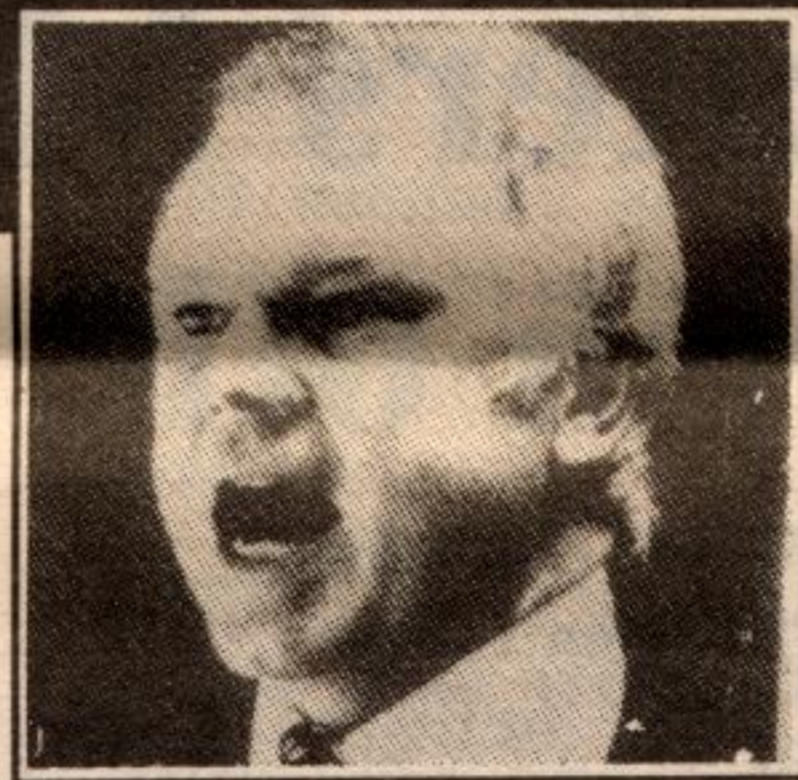
