Shevalier reaches 100 points in 2 of 3 OHL years

Jeff Shevalier finished his Ontario Hockey League (OHL) regular season career on Friday with 101 points, reaching the century mark for the second straight season.

A satisfying year for the North Bay Centennials centre and Acton Sabre product, who finished 12 points shy of last year's 59-goal, 54-assist effort.

"You have to be satisfied," he quipped on Sunday. "I was playing a more defensive role on the third line this year and that's a lot of points for that line. I also did some penalty killing and played the power play (11 PP goals)."

Shevalier, 19, said he will be a member of the National Hockey League's Los Angeles Kings next year or with Phoenix of the International Hockey League.


