The letter stated that the YMCA had done all they could to try and develop alternative uses and funding strategies for the building, but have been unsuccessful in their attempt, since 1991, to find adequate tenants for the building.

The letter stated that proceeds from the sale of the building will remain in Acton to be used by the YMCA to expand their programs.

### Vehicles get stickers

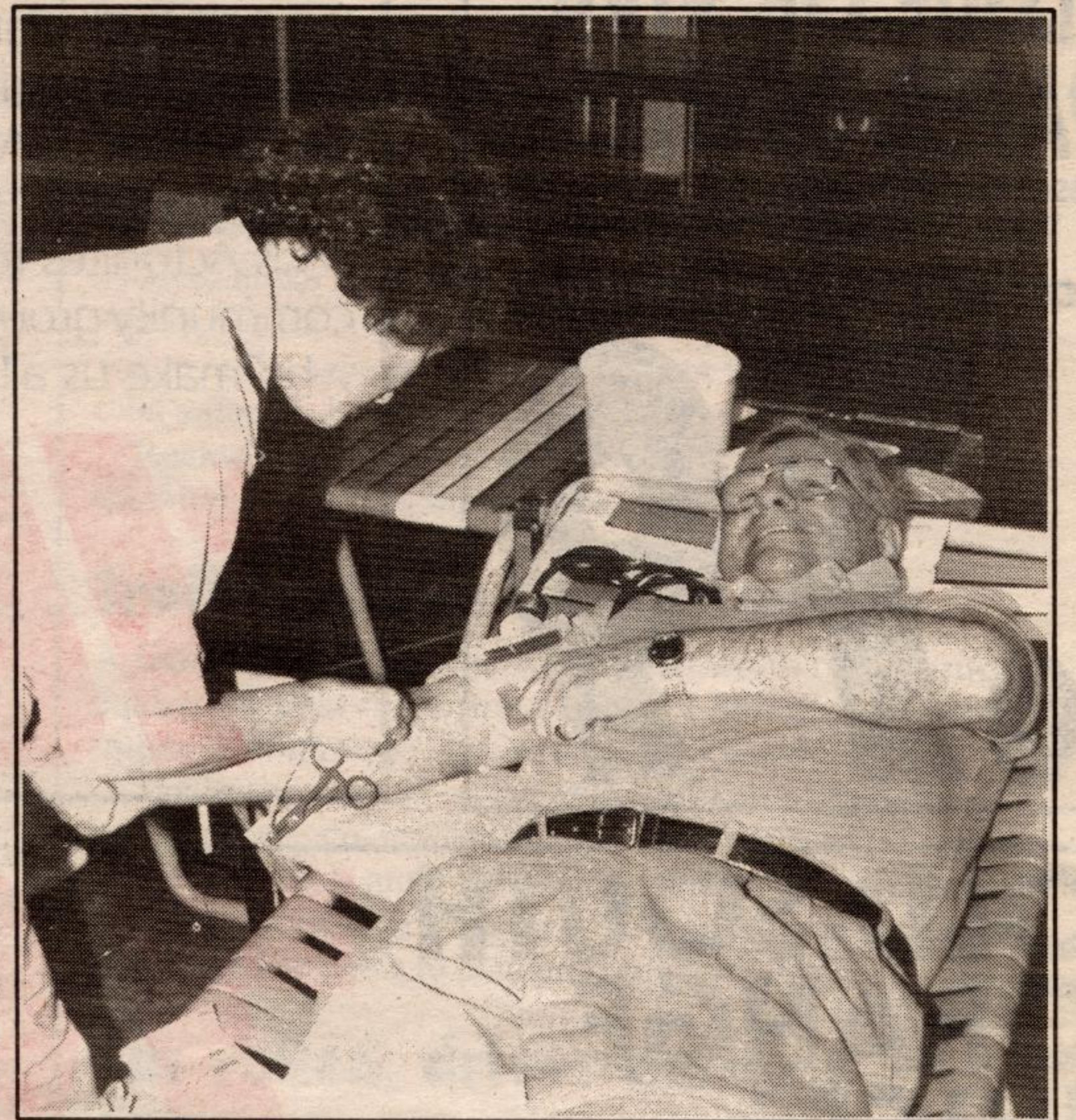
Council voted unanimously in favour of attaching bumper stickers with the logo "Good Neighbours" on all town vehicles in support of Acton Social Services' campaign.
