Mr. Ward and our principal read off the names of Grade 7 and 8 students who made the honour role. These students had 80 per cent or over in all subjects. Jenny

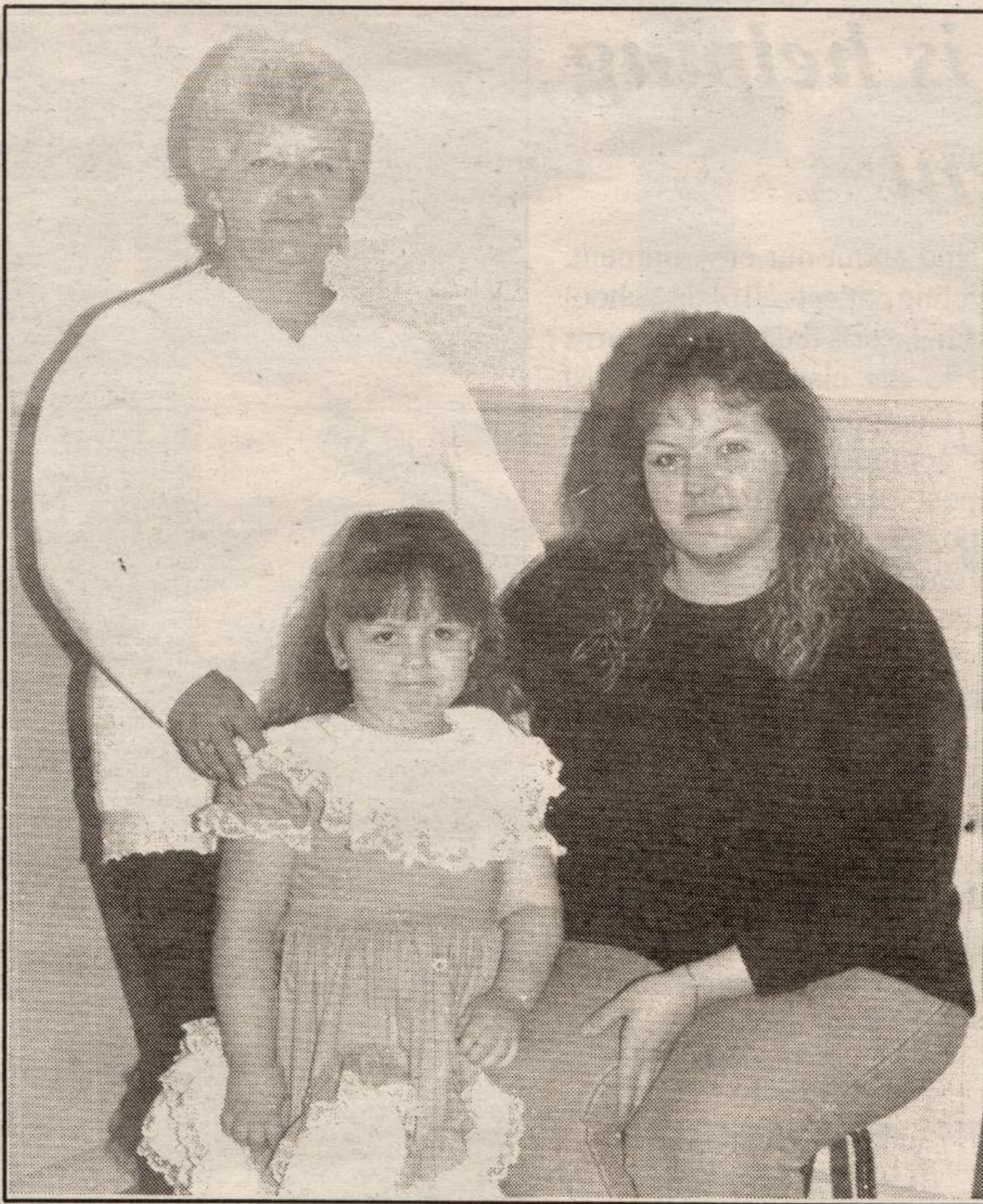

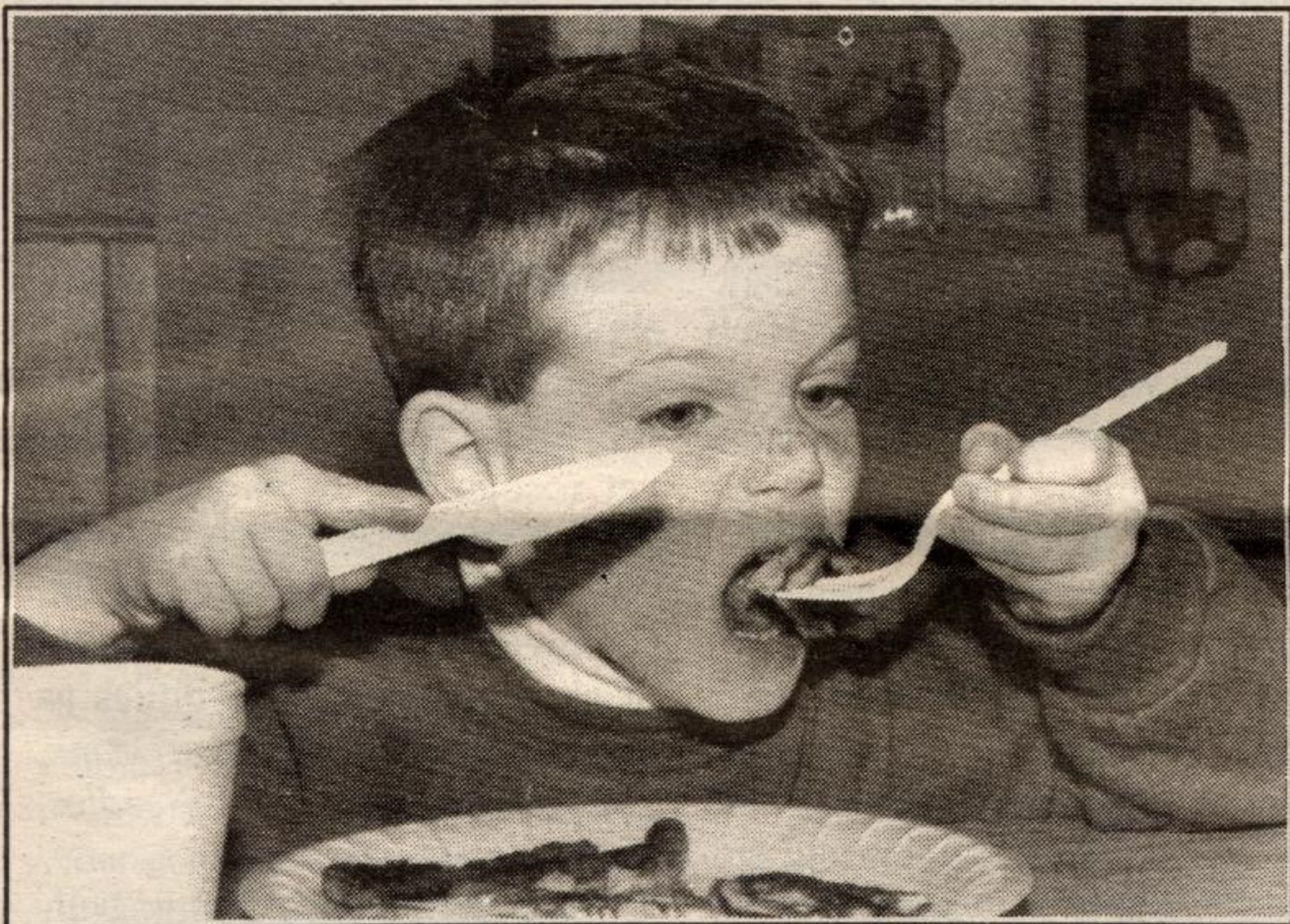
