The first meeting of the Nassagaweya Branch of the Women's Institute was held at the home of Mrs. Austin Fletcher on May 17, 1934. At this meeting, the Institute motto "For Home and Country" was accepted and the objectives of the group identified.

Sixty years later, the Women's Institute continues to live up to these objectives, meeting the needs of the community.

Nan Gates, president, says, "It is exciting to be a member of the Women's Institute. Not only are we celebrating our 60th Anniversary, but our provincial body is busy planning the 100th birthday of the Women's Institute."

Over the years, the Women's Institute has been a supporter of the community, including adopting Brookville School, the Community Hall, and Halton's Women's Place as beneficiaries. It has provided the school with its initial First Aid Kit, Provincial flags to hang in the library, an educational farm kit, and books for the library.
