



Juno winner at St. Joe's

Music is the most important part of Jack Grunsky's life and he let Acton know it a few weeks ago.

The children's performer, a 1992 Juno award winner and 1993 nominee, dazzled students at St. Joseph's School on May 5 with his guitar prowess, assortment of percussion instruments and ability to get the audience off its feet.

The day was declared Imaginary Window Day at St. Joseph's School, a program involving and encouraging parent and community interaction.

Grunsky arrived at the school early in the morning to rehearse, prepared activities with various classes who used the musician's music as their source. Grunsky then incorporated their projects in his afternoon school performance.

The day-long visit by the 48year-old artist concluded in the evening with an open house family concert.

"It's enjoyable," said Grunsky of the Imaginary Window Day theme, following his 45-minute show before a packed gathering of Grade 1 to 6 pupils. "It gives the teachers and students the chance to dig into the experience of music-making."

The native of Austria performs about 150 shows a year at schools, public events and festivals.
