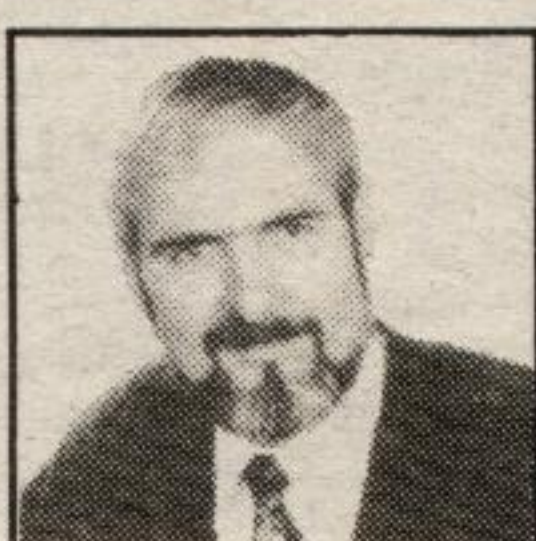

Women alone be aware!

The best prevention to being attacked, is to not be alone. The buddy system is a great way to prevent crimes. This is not always possible and in the event of a unwanted attack follow these tips.

- Scream and run to the nearest residence or business. Cries for help can discourage criminals and may result in their arrest.
- If you choose to physically resist, take advantage of any "weapons" you may have — such as a purse or umbrella.
- Attempt to determine points of identification such as clothing, glasses, hair colour and height. Call the police immediately.
- The choice of whether or not to physically resist an attack can only be made by you. If the assailant is armed, your options are limited. There is no way to predict an attacker's actions.
