

Fatal accident west of Acton

A man and woman were killed Sunday morning, just after midnight, after a southbound pick-up slammed into a westbound Camaro on the First Line and Sideroad 15 in Moffat. The deadly crash occurred at 12:15 am, June 5.

Michael Mains and Darlene Lamb, occupants of the Camaro, were killed in the accident and the 17-year-old driver of the truck is being treated for a broken leg and collar bone.

The investigation is continuing by Regional Traffic Unit. Alcohol does not seem to have been a factor in the collision.

Mill Street car thief nabbed

A 1993 Ford van stolen from Mill Street last Wednesday was recovered two hours later. The OPP stopped the vehicle at 7 pm in Shelburne and arrested a 28-year-old Brampton man for impaired driving and possession of stolen goods.

Police say the van was unlocked and the keys were "available" when it was stolen earlier that evening.

Burglars grab \$16,000 worth

Thieves entered an Acton area home last Thursday and stole over \$16,000 worth of electronic equipment, jewellery and silverware.

Police say the break-in and theft occurred during daylight hours, between 8 am and 4:30 pm, after thieves gained entry to the house on R.R. 3, Acton, through the garage

Items reported stolen include a VCR, stereo equipment, 100 CDs, 150 videotapes, jewellery, silverware and a comcorder. Police say the burglary is still under investigation.

Food thief runs into police

A man fleeing store employees after stealing two steaks from the Foodland in Erin, ran right into the custody of a OPP officer. The policeman had just left the village constable's office and was about to mount his motorcycle when he spotted the suspect heading right for him.

A 29-year-old Orangeville man has been charged with theft under. The reported value of the steaks was \$20.
