There is a biblical garden, de-

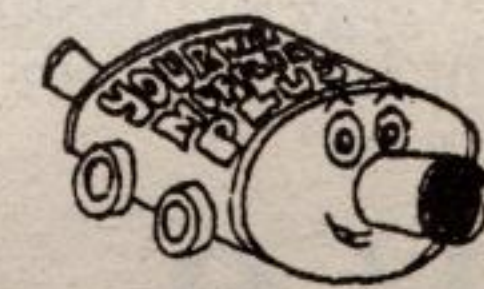
voted to over 100 plants mentioned in the Holy Bible. The gardens are 10 minutes from Stratford.

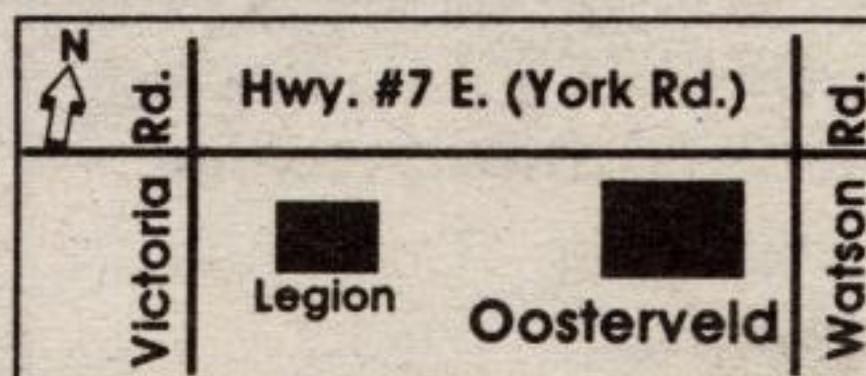
