Dump may be history

 mation Systems Incorporated's plans to turn a mined-out portion of its quarry south of Acton into a massive landfill site.

Acton Councillors and local environmentalists are crossing their fingers and hoping that the Bill will pass.

"This has taken a lot of work by a lot of people," said Barbara Halsall of Protect Our Water and Environmental Resources (POWER) at Monday night's General Committee meeting.

"Noel Duigan has worked very hard on this issue and so has the Town."

At Council last week, Acton's Rick Bonnette recommended that several letters supporting the bill be sent to Premier Bob Rae.

"The three Acton Councillors wrote all members of the Legislature urging them to support Duignan's Bill 62," Bonnette said following the meeting.

"We have letters from Bud Wildman (Minister of Environment and Energy), Mike Harris (PC leader) and Lyn McLeod (Liberal leader) supporting the Bill. Maybe Rae will get the message if we send all this information to him," Bonnette said.

In an earlier letter to the Premier Acton Councillors told Rae that the application to use part of the quarry as a dump has held back capital projects and cost the Town almost \$1 million to fight.

"There could be a fall election. The NDP is coming to the end of its mandate and we want this dealt with," Bonnette said.

Bill 62 received second reading in April of last year and was referred to the Standing Committee on Administration of Justice for clause-by-clause consideration.

Police looking for Acton flasher

Authorities are continuing to investigate a complaint from a 25-year-old Acton woman who saw a naked youth masturbating outside her Ransom Street apartment last Monday night. The suspect fled when he saw the woman pick up the phone to call police.

The complainant was unable to identify the suspect from mug shots, but gave a detailed description of him. Police are looking for a white male, about 5'8" tall and 17 years of age with brown hair, green eyes, fair skin and a slim build.

OPP officers arrested a 16-year-old youth for car theft last Wednesday afternoon. The youth had been pulled over for speeding when police discovered the car had been stolen from Budget Rent-a-Car earlier in the day.

Radar clocked the car travelling at 133 km in an 80 km zone on Hwy. 24, west of Erin. A 15-year-old girl was also in the car but she was not charged.

Drunk driver nabbed

A 45-year-old Acton man is charged with impaired driving after a Peel Regional officer spotted him driving in an erratic manner and followed him to his home on Elmore Drive.

The off-duty policeman arrested the man and turned him over to the custody of Halton Regional police when they arrived shortly afterward. The incident occurred just after 1 am. Friday.
