# Giguere says 'you gotta have fun'

Pat Giguere doesn't go looking for fame and fortune.

But fame, if not fortune, has found her, as Giguere was named Halton Hills Senior Citizen of the Year for 1994.

"I never thought it would happen," says the Acton resident and Tanner columnist, who was honoured by the Town at a ceremony recently. "I do community work because I have fun. You have to have fun, because you're dead too long."

Giguere was given the award for her significant contribution to the community during her senior years.

"It's a great honour and I appreciate the fact I was nominated, but I don't know whether or not I deserve it. I feel very, very humble. I don't do things to get recognized," she says.

The 77-year-old moved to Acton in 1982 after spending 28 years working at the Canadian Landforces and Command Staff College in Kingston.

Giguere joined the Golden Age Club in town, and was treasurer for a year before being appointed travel convenor. After travelling herself, from 1984-87, she returned as second vice-president in 1988. Giguere advanced to first vicepresident in 1990 before becoming president in '92.

"I'm interested in working with seniors. There's so much talent among them," Giguere exclaims.
