Charlotte showed us how to make a cute yarn kitten using a stick.


Our meeting closed with the U.C.W. prayer and we spent a very enjoyable time with our host and hostess and upon leaving wished each other a safe and happy summer.

Since September, Duane has awoke — usually twice a week to droppings from man's best friend on his lawn or the sidewalk beside his Matthew Court home.



Duane, although bothered by


the occurrences, joked about installing a video camera to his house and catching the dogs in the act. Lori, though, was more direct in her displeasure.

Tips for seniors


We begin our series on Crimeproofing by offering tips to local seniors who want to crimeproof their lives by being careful, alert, cautious and aware.






