After a scoreless two innings, Acton scored five in the third as Moreland, Cullen, Hall and Richie Dalziel crossed the plate.

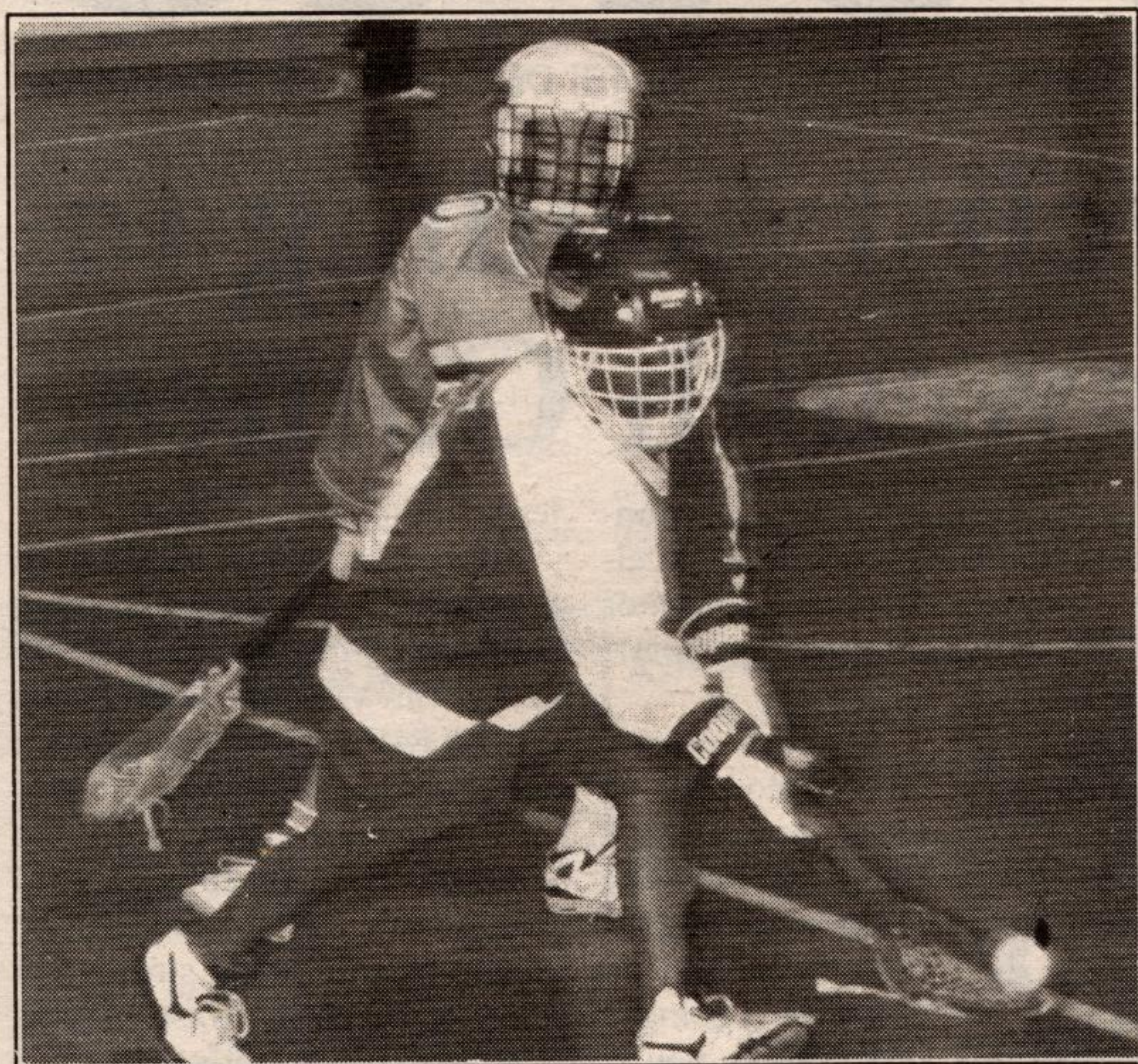
Acton increased its lead to 11-0 the next inning as Coles, Justin

THE WRATH OF GRAPES

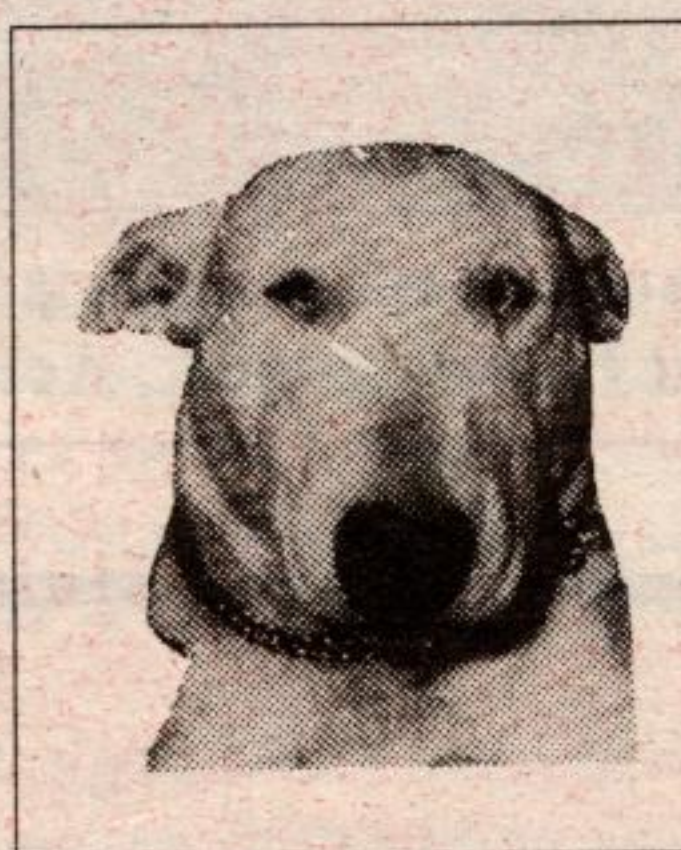
WITH DON CHERRY
