Fall election could bring changes

There could be a lot of new faces on Eramosa Council following November's municipal election.

One current councillor will not seek re-election and two others are leaning the same way.

Counc. Dale Hamilton will not seek re-election after one term and Reeve Leverne Harris and Counc. Rick Hughes said they have not made up their minds, but are leaning toward not running.

Deputy reeve Ken Mercer is on holidays and could not be reached; neither could Counc. Gord Tosh.

All five members of Eramosa Council were elected in 1991 in the defeat of previous Council over the development issue.

Although Reeve Harris has publicly stated he will not run again, in an interview on Sunday he left his options open.

"I've let people know that I'm not running and that's my position at this time but, of course you can always change your mind up until Friday, Oct. 14.

"In other areas people may have already filed their nomination papers but in Eramosa nobody makes it official until the last week.

"My decision may change. Everything is in a state of flux. I have a lot of other things to do but I think the public has to decide who they want to run for them and I'm not sure what the public is doing."

Counc. Rick Hughes said he hates to sound like he's playing his cards close to his vest but he doesn't know what his plans are.

"I haven't fully made up my mind yet but I find that my daily commute to Hamilton for my job means that I don't always feel that I'm totally plugged into the community," Hughes said Sunday.

"I'm just coming off two weeks holiday and a short hiatus from Council and I haven't talked to anybody in the community to find out what's going on," Hughes said.

"I wish I could be more definitive but at this point in time I haven't made up my mind. A lot will depend on who is running."

Counc. Dale Hamilton said she will not seek re-election because she wants to spend more time with her family and on her career.

"To be perfectly honest I don't regret running last time but being an elected official was disillusioning. I think I could be just as effective as a member of a committee of council as I was as a councillor," Hamilton said Monday.

"I found there was a lot of house-keeping and maintenance issues to be dealt with and I would have preferred to be able to deal with more specific issues that I was interested in.

"I won't rule out running again some time in the future when my family is older and I have more time to give to the job."
