And why would they when it was hot hitting that seemed to be hovering over the locals' bench against Limehouse in their bestof-three semi-final series.


Matthew Shibley led the attack with two homers, including a grand slam, as the Legion which topped the regular season

Finals began Monday night at Prospect Park.




