## Hide House retires CIBC debt

According to John Brison, chief financial officer at the Hide House, a portion of the invested funds were utilized to fully retire the company's bank debt, while the remaining funds will be used for "working capital."

The Hide House's will now be

doing its banking at the Bank of Montreal; it's now-retired debt was to the Bank of Commerce.

"Working Ventures' investment significantly strengthens our balance sheet and ensures that the remaining payments under the 1993 Proposal to Creditors will be remitted on schedule and that all future purchases will be paid for

within normal time frames," explained Brison.

The Hide House closed last June 15 and the past 14 months have been trying ones for company management.

Last week's Working Ventures investment, coupled with the reopening of Jack Tanner's Table, has this community looking a lot more like "Leathertown" again.

## Tannery break-in


