Rennie seeks 4th Council term

Acton municipal councillor Gerald Rennie filed registration papers Monday and will be running again for Area Councillor for Ward 1 in the upcoming election.

"There are four reasons I've decided to seek re-election," explained Rennie. "The first reason concerns development in Acton East — I want to see that through to completion.

"Second, I would like to see the Acton Arena project completed. This project really should be finished in '96.

"Also, I want to continue working on the Acton Seniors' recreation centre. Right now we're in the process of negotiating with the Laurentian Bank over the use of the old FlightLine building

"And finally, I would like to continue to work with the BIA in their efforts to rejuvenate the downtown core."

Rennie also hinted at another of his priorities: "Over the last three

years we've managed to come in with a zero tax increase, and we should continue to be careful with how we spend money. I'd like to keep taxes down, and get these (Acton development) projects finished.

Rennie is completing his third term as an Acton representative on Halton Hills town council.

Rennie, 63, lives with his wife Joyce on Churchill Road North. The Orangeville native has lived in Acton since the fall of 1969. He is assistant head of the English department at North Park secondary school in Brampton.

"Working with (fellow Acton councillors) Rick Bonnette and Norm Elliott has been a real treasure over the years," said Rennie.

"Assuming that we all get elected again, I'm looking forward to working with them. There's no competition among us, and we work well together."

Rennie stressed that the approaching term will be a critical one for this community.

"It's time to move forward. These are crucial years for the future of Acton. Things have to be done and they have to be done now."

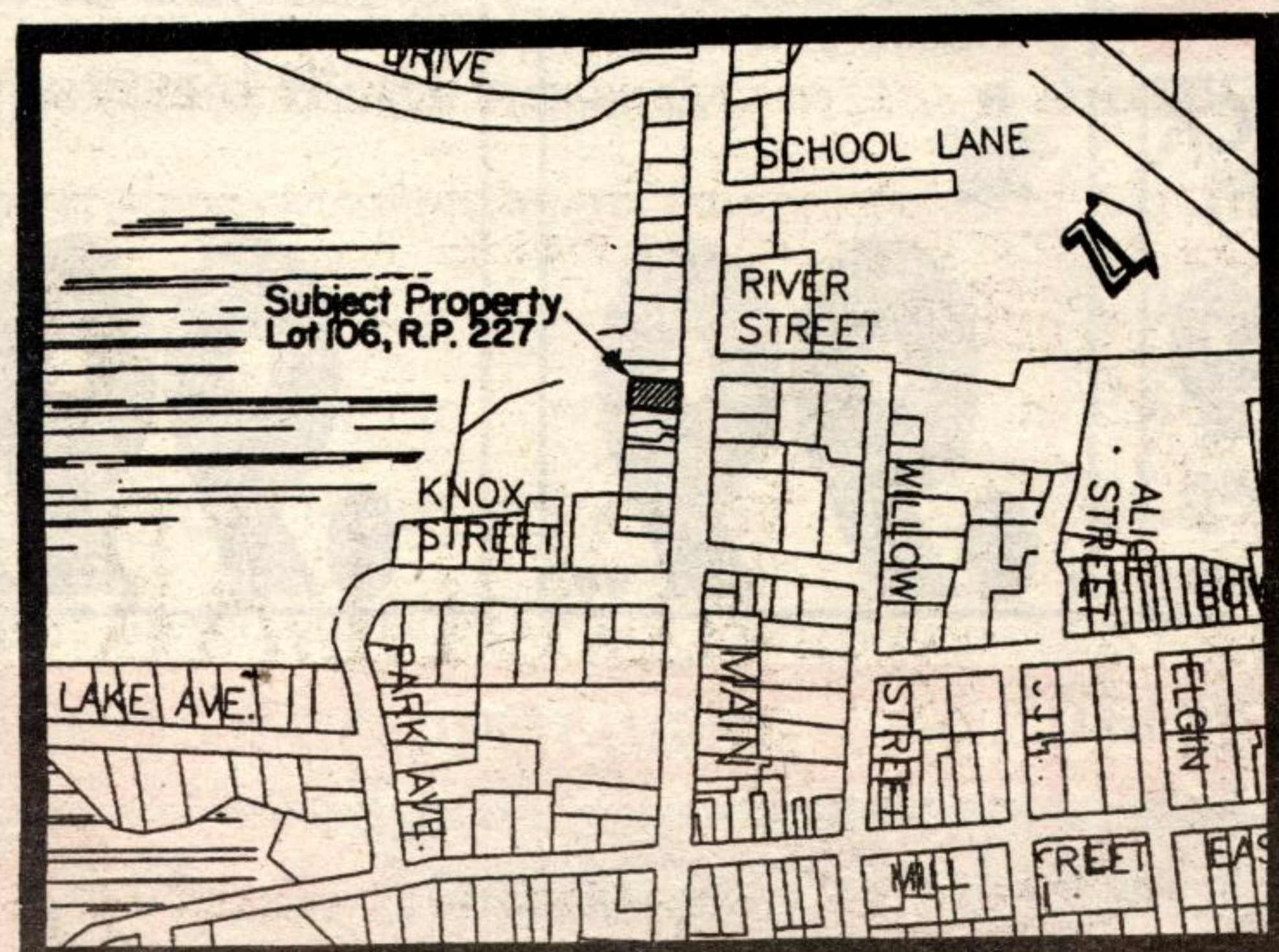
