Club members will be going for a cruise on Lake Rousseau next Friday, and will later drop in at a cranberry farm in Bala. There's a waiting list for this day-trip

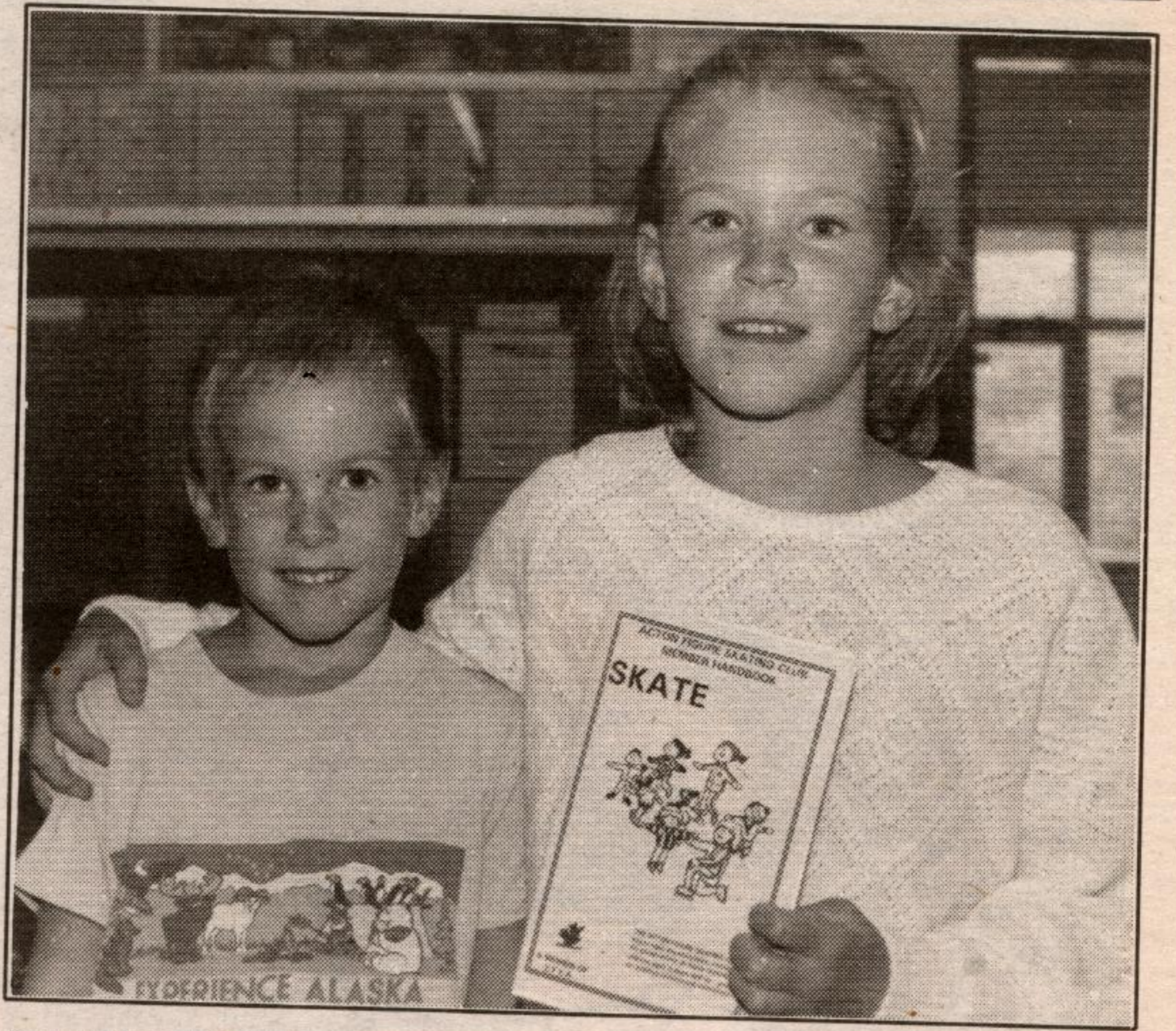

Peanut Club coming soon

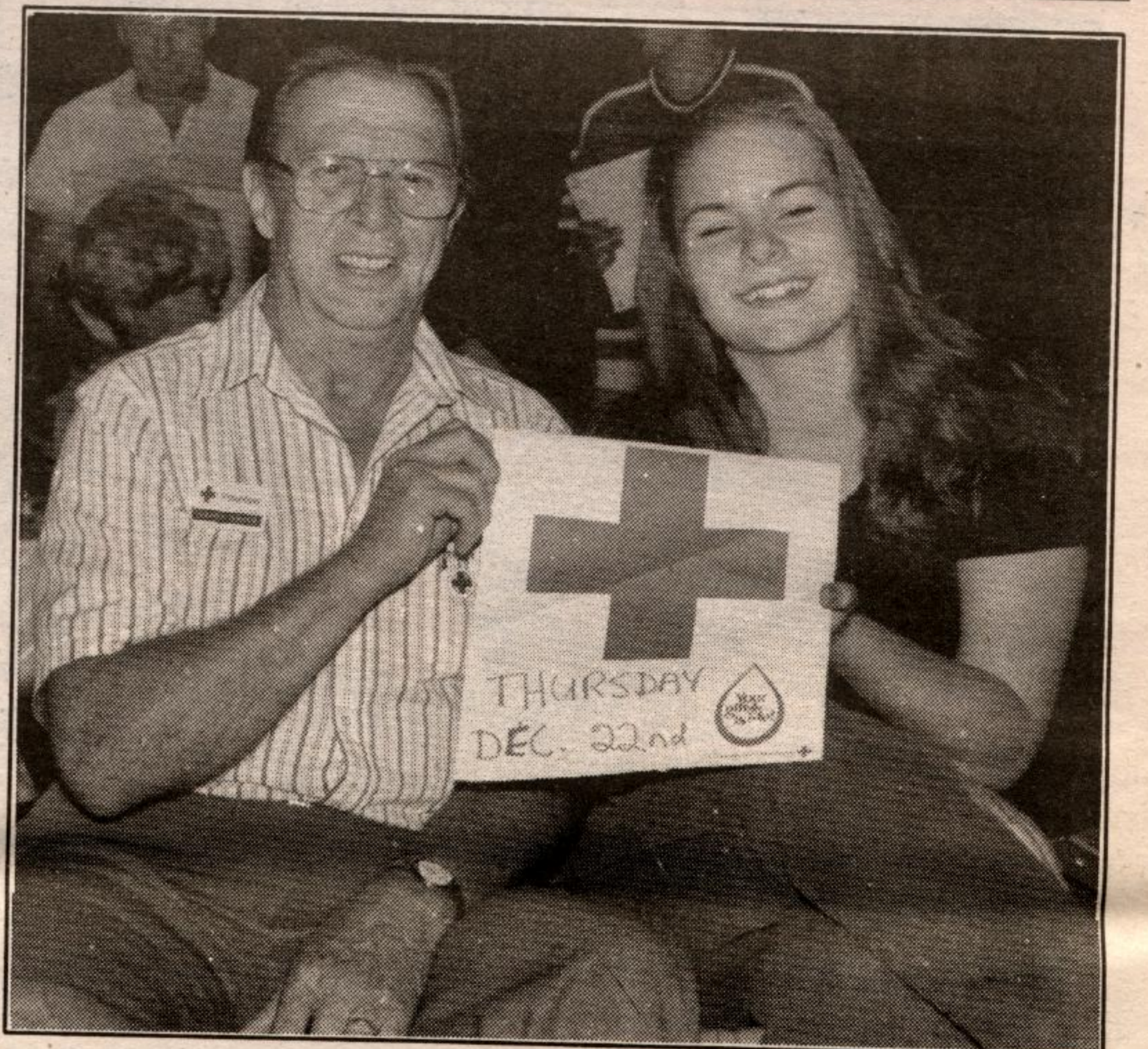

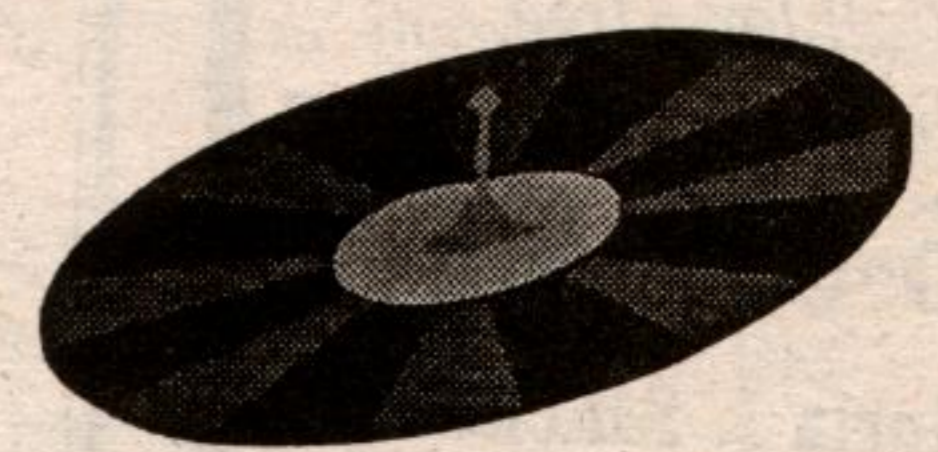
