Andrews impressed with AHS trackers

Acton Redmen track coach Bruce Andrews says his cross-country athletes are finding themselves, they're pleased with their work and feels he can't ask anymore than that.

But on Monday he stopped short of saying it was a good start for the team, which competed on Friday at the Laurel Creek invitational event in Kitchener.

Acton High's three athletes — Michael Andrews, first-year runner Chrissy Seehaver and Glen Kilmer — used the meet as a primer for today's (Wednesday's) Kelso Invitational meet at Kelso Conservation Area in Milton.

Andrews competed in the Boys' 6,100-metre Junior run, finishing 56th out of 276 finishers.

It was a rough start for the 16-year-old Andrews, who found himself at 140th after 800m. But he quickly rebounded, nudging his way up to 69th, then to 53rd before being caught by three runners.

"He knew he got off to a rotten race," said the coach, "but he didn't give up. A lot of those runners were the best in the province, so this lets him know where he's at."

The elder Andrews says his 95-pound athlete is capable of cracking the top 30 today if the weather and his start are good.

Seehaver, competing in her first high school race, ran to a 71st place finish in the field of 160 Midget Girls' 3,000m athletes.

"She ran well (the first half of the race) in Kitchener. It was just intimidating for her. It was good for her to get into a high school event to find out what it's like. I was pleased with her effort."

Kilmer, though, was hampered by a sore right heel he injured playing baseball and sat 161st of 225 after the Midget Boys' event.

"When he finished the race he was pretty sore. I don't think he'll run this week," said Andrews.

Andrews will be the lone Redmen runner for a meet at High Park in Toronto this Saturday.
