## Top athletes head Senior v-ballers

One thing's for certain with the Redmen Senior Boys' volleyball squad — they won't perform any worse than last campaign.

Quite simply because the Senior outfit folded — due to a lack of coaches—before the players could dress for their first practice.

But coach Bruce Andrews is optimistic, because he's got 10 athletes, who despite not having played in a year, are good athletes. Arguably the school's best.

What has impressed the coach is how keen his players are. To begin the year, each player signed a contract stating if he's caught smoking on school property, he's immediately released.

Plus, the players must be at the school by 7 am and warmed up by 7:10 am. They have yet to let Andrews down.

"I don't think any coach could be more pleased with them," An-

Right now, though, the Redmen aren't quick in getting to the ball.

"When you play against a good team, the game goes fast," said Andrews, noting the Georgetown Rebels posess a number of club players. "You've got to get the

second hit to the setter.

"And no matter how much you do it in practice, once you switch to a scrimmage, everything goes out the window."

Andrews admitted his team's court coverage will be sloppy at the outset of the season, but he'll rely on all 10 guys, not just the ones on the court at any one time.

"No matter how many we're putting out (on the floor), we're all doing it together," he declared.


