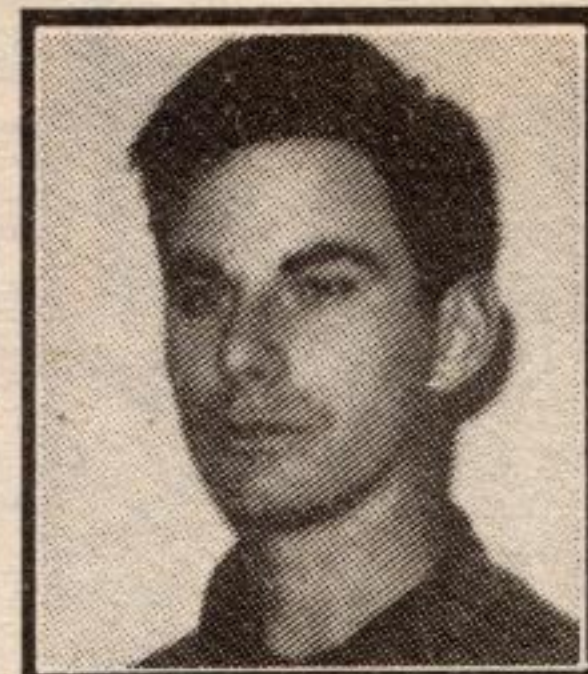

Town, reps being sued for \$7M

A process server received a rude welcome from one Town Councillor on Monday night as he attempted to serve all Halton Hills municipal councillors with notice — a statement of claim — that they are being sued for \$7 million.

As the server presented Council. Rob Heaton with his copy of the statement, Heaton began to yell "Get out! Get out!" to the perplexed server.

Heaton angrily yelled "I don't need your threats," and threw the papers at the retreating server, who then left.

The Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills and all Council members except Mayor Russ Miller are being sued by Equity Waste Management. At issue is Council's decision to pass an interim by-law freezing development in the 401-Steeles Avenue industrial corridor.

The Town by-law was reversed by an Ontario Court Judge, who ruled Council acted in "bad faith" and was more interested in getting re-elected than in good planning.

The lawsuit asks for damages of \$5 million for abuse of statutory power, abuse of process, interference of economic relations, and abuse of public office.

The statement of claim also says that the individual councillors' conduct amounts to a malicious and deliberate abuse of public office calculated to injure Equity, and so the company wants \$1 million for exemplary, punitive and aggravated damages.

Equity also wants \$1 million in damages from Halton Hills by "virtue of its outrageous and hei-

nous conduct."

Council will hold a special meeting today (Wednesday) to announce whether it will appeal the court ruling that quashed the freeze by-law.
