#### 1994 MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS NOTICE TO ELECTORS - NOMINATIONS

**NOTICE** is hereby given that **NOMINATIONS FOR ELECTED OFFICE** for the 1994 - 1997 term must be filed with the Returning Officer between **TUES., OCT. 11** and **FRI., OCT. 14, 1994**.

**EVERY** person who proposes to be a candidate for any office must first file a **NOTICE OF REGISTRATION** on the prescribed form with the Returning Officer, prior to being nominated.

**NOMINATIONS** on the prescribed form will be accepted by the Returning Officer for the following elected offices:

#### A. THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS

- MAYOR** (total of 1)
- one (1) to be elected at - large
  - to serve as a member of Regional Council, Town Council and the Hydro Commission
- LOCAL COUNCILLORS** (total of 8)
- two (2) to be elected from each of four (4) Wards
  - to serve as a member of Town Council
- REGIONAL COUNCILLORS** (total of 4)
- one (1) to be elected from each of four (4) Wards
  - to serve as a member of both Regional Council and Town Council

#### B. HALTON HILLS HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION

- HYDRO COMMISSIONERS** (total of 4)
- one (1) to be elected from each of the four (4) Wards
  - to serve on the Halton Hills Hydro-Electric Commission

#### C. HALTON BOARD OF EDUCATION

- TRUSTEES** (total of 2)
- one (1) to be elected by Public School Electors from the combined areas of Ward 1 (former Town of Acton) and Ward 2 (former Township of Esquesing)
  - one (1) to be elected by Public School Electors from the combined areas of Wards 3 and 4 (former Town of Georgetown)
  - to serve as members of the Board of School Trustees for the Halton Board of Education

#### D. HALTON ROMAN CATHOLIC SCHOOL BOARD

- ENGLISH LANGUAGE TRUSTEE** (total of 1)
- one (1) to be elected at-large by Separate School English Electors within the Town of Halton Hills

- **FRI., OCT. 14 (NOMINATION DAY), from 9 am to 5 pm**

**NOMINATIONS** shall:

- be accepted for **REGISTERED CANDIDATES** only
- be on the prescribed form
- be completed in full, including office and ward (if appropriate) for which the candidate is running
- be signed by at least ten (10) electors who are qualified to vote for that office and include both their name and their qualifying address
- be nominated by Public School Elector for the positions of Public School Trustees
- be nominated by Separate School Electors for the position of Separate School Trustees
- be filed in person by the candidate or their agent

**REGISTRATION FORMS** and **NOMINATION FORMS** are available at the Office of the Returning Officer, Clerk's Department, Civic Centre.

**NOTICE** is hereby given that the onus is on the person nominated to file a bona fide nomination paper.

**NOMINATIONS** for elected office, duly certified by the Returning Officer, including name, address and office, will be posted at the Civic Centre.

# Downtown Acton gets shrubs, trees with 'green' plan

Acton's Business Improvement Association (BIA) held a special meeting last Wednesday to step up plans to get more greenery on the corners of downtown streets.

BIA secretary Gerald Rennie is anxious "to get the ball rolling" on a project that will see trees and shrubs planted on Mill Street to add more colour and beautify the town.

"The feeling is the downtown doesn't have the colour and freshness it could," said Rennie on Thursday. "Along with the addition of new street signs it should perk up the place.

"More greenery makes the downtown more beautiful and entices people to shop here. I'm not panicking, just making sure plans are moving."

Rennie's intent to progress faster comes for good reason. He mentioned the BIA had hoped to get the greenery project started this year and added, "if you make a decision to do something, don't let it hang."

Juris Berzins of Urban Design Consultants in Toronto has been hired to draw plans of the new-look Acton and will present his proposal of where greenery should go to BIA members next Friday.

At this time, Berzins will indicate how many parking spaces will be sacrificed and how far the greenery will jet out onto Mill Street, so as to not impede traffic.

While no dimensions have been determined, Rennie did say alternative parking could come from the south end of John Street and/or from the old fire hall if the Town chooses to demolish it.

Whether or not there will be less parking on Mill Street, Rennie doesn't foresee a snag in planning.

"I hope not. It (greenery) is to the merchant's advantage. Greenery would make each business more appealing ... I would like to think the project will be done within a year, maybe six months," Rennie predicted.

Once Berzins has presented his work, Rennie and Co. will take his sketches to various merchants for their input and, if positive, will then approach Town council for approval.

Meanwhile, last week Berzins also presented drawings of a refurbished downtown, including an overhaul of facades to some buildings.

"I was impressed with what he's proposing, but I think more merchants have to take him up on the idea of changing their look."
