


POKER FACES?

The house was not entered. Police are looking for two white males in their late teens or early 20s.

Home owners foil thieves

Halton Police report a break-in at a residence on Kingham Road. The occupants returned home on Saturday at 9:30 pm and observed a non-white male standing outside the house.

When the residents went inside they found two white males coming down the stairs.

The three men fled on foot and police were contacted. The investigation found that nothing was disturbed and that the thieves had entered through a basement window.


