ASSIC ALERT

Power of Attorney: Do I need one? What do I do? Who should I go to?

These are not easy questions but, yes, you do need one if you wish to have someone you choose in control of your personal care and finances in a situation where you are no longer mentally capable of making decisions.

The Substitute Decisions Act comes into effect in January of 1995 and does give the Office of the Public Trustee the right to appoint a substitute decision maker

for you if you haven't chosen one. The Office of the Public Trustee has put out a free kit that can be picked up at ASSIC. This can be filled out and is legal and effective provided that you read and work through the material. Stationery stores also have good forms at

very low costs. For the individual who is not able to read or understand the package, there are services such as Paralegal Central — a private for profit organization (not lawyers) that offers a package. They will walk you through the information and write the power of attorney for you with the information you provide. They also supply the frills such as wallet cards, storage, etc. The cost for this package is \$80.


Your lawyer can do a financial power of attorney for \$25 to \$50. Personal Care Power of Attorney can be done upon request but legislation does not make them legal until the Substitute Decisions Act comes into effect in January 1995.




