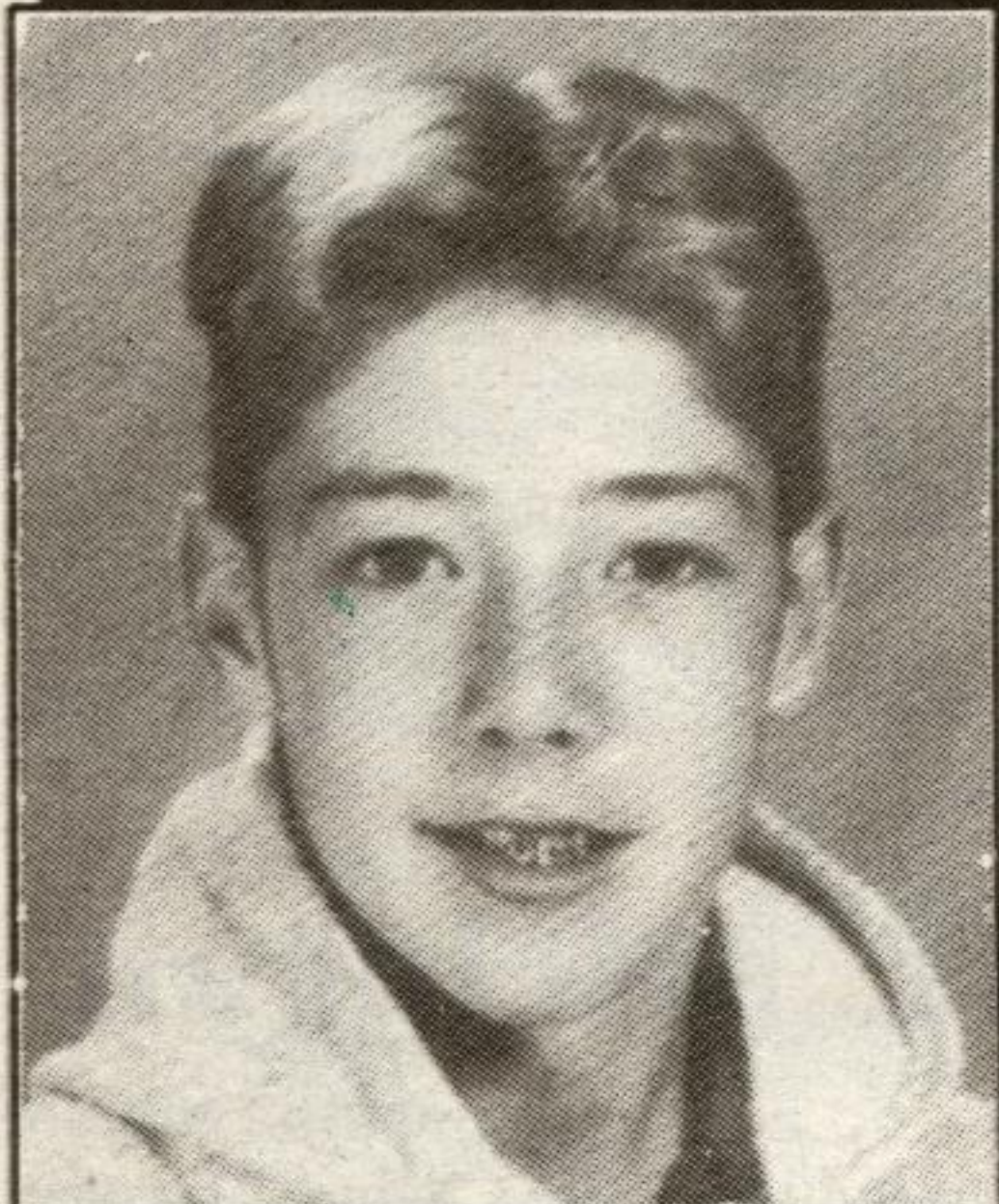


HOCKEY REPORT

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



JON ROUTLEDGE

Jon, on the basis of his 10 points (four goals, six assists) over five games, including the exhibition season, has been named one of two AMHA Players of the Week. Jon's efforts helped his Bantam Firefighters team to wins over Orangeville (5-1), Arthur (9-2) and Milton (9-1 — pre-season).

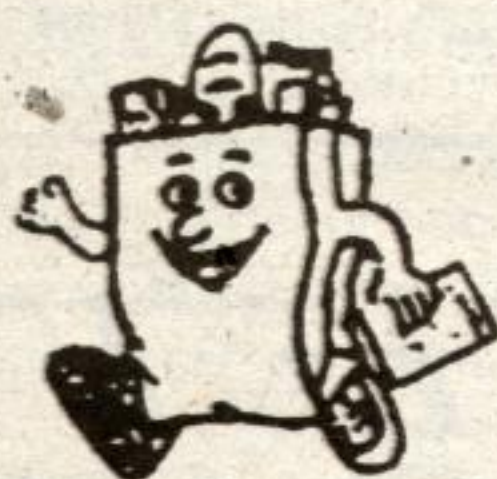
